
## Bf 109G-14/U4, flown by Uffz. Anton Kellmayer, 7./ JG 52, Babolnapuszta, Hungary, January 1945

Erich Hartmann, first used this aircraft in October 1944, but as of January 1945, it had already been piloted by Uffz. Anton Kellmayer, of 7. Staffel JG 52. The original appearance of the aircraft from October 1944 had changed. In accord with the command of September 22nd, 1944, the aircraft of Luftflotte 4, the JG 52 was part of this unit, were supposed to be marked with a yellow letter "V" on the underside of the left wing. The command came into effect on September 25th, 1944, and the aircraft were supposed to be marked this way due to the possible mistaking for Romanian Air Force aircraft that joined the Allied forces after being part of the Nazi Germany forces. The pictures, taken in October 1944, do not show the "V" clearly. In January 1945, the aircraft certainly had it, though. Another change represents the 7./ JG 52 sign on the engine cover.



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
