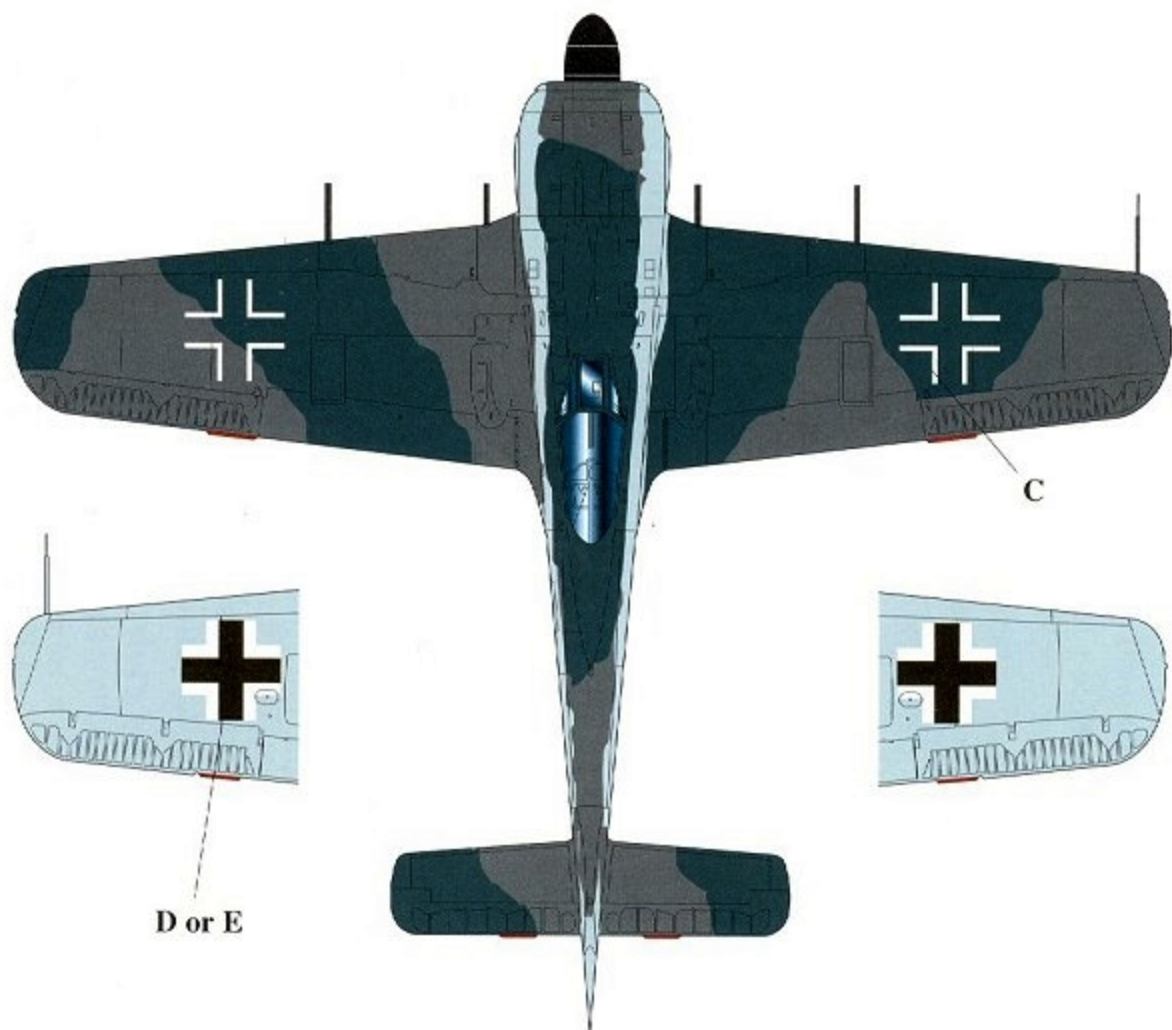

**"Red 11"** Fw 190 A-8 W. Nr. 681992 Pilot: Uffz. Dieter Göthel 10/JG 301 20 January 1945 Heller Germany

This was a 10. Staffel aircraft; Göthel crashed this machine while flying with the 9. Staffel. No antenna pulley on canopy. Extra wire supports on armored headrest. ETC 501 rack with E2 steel drop tank.

**Colors:** Undersurfaces; 76 Light Blue; Uppersurfaces 75 Gray Violet; 74 Gray Green;

Unusual White/Green/White fuselage bands thought to be an experimental identification for *Schwammfahrer* similar to some units painting the tail section all white. A JG 301 veteran supplied this information.

Spinner: Black with White spiral. Prop Blades: 70 Black Green

**National Markings:** Fuselage; B4 800 mm all Black crosses, probably H3 all Black Hakenkreuz

Wings; Upper B6 910 mm White crosses, Lower - probably B4 900 mm Black crosses.

**Stenciling:** Probably factory standard, front half of "lift here" stencil on rear fuselage is painted over with White band. Reference: 1. page 298

**"Red 1"** Fw 190 A-8 W. Nr. Unknown Pilot: Lt. Hans Dortenmann Staffelführer 4/JG 54 Late June 1944 Villacoublay France

No antenna pulley on canopy. ETC 501 rack. Drop tank has 2 carrying straps. 2. Staffel was reassigned from Russia to the invasion front, re-numbered 4. Staffel and incorporated into III. Gruppe JG 54.

**Colors:** Undersurfaces; 76 Light Blue; Uppersurfaces 75 Gray Violet; 74 Gray Green; heavy mottling 75/74

"1" and vertical III. Gruppe bar Red. Blue RV band. III. Gruppe shield in Green Heart on both sides of fuselage.

Spinner: Black with White spiral to panel line. Prop blades; 70 Black Green. 2/JG 54 Staffel emblem on port side of motor cowl.

Yellow undercowl. Name: *kascherl I (or hascherl)* Red/White on port side under cockpit. Red/White striped 16 Zy antenna mast.

Black exhaust panel. Red latch buttons on fuselage access door.

**National Markings:** Fuselage; B3 800 mm Black and White crosses, H2a Hakenkreuz.

Wings; Upper - B6 910 mm White crosses, Lower - B3 900 mm Black and White crosses.

**Stenciling:** Factory Standard. Red circle at bottom of cowl ring.

**"Yellow 8"** Fw 190 A-8 W. Nr. Unknown Pilot: Unknown 7/JG 301 May 1945 Location Unknown

Example of pieced-together parts of different colors at assembly points or in the field. Possibly blown canopy. Rare VDM 9 12153 metal propeller with external pitch control weights (see drawing). ETC 501 rack. For additional color reference see **Fw 190 Part 1 Colortech #1** by Thomas Tullis.

**Colors:** Undersurfaces; 76 Light Blue, Uppersurfaces; 81 upper fuselage, 74 Gray Green gun cover cowl, rudder 76/74 mixed.

70 Black Green motor cowl, 75 Gray Violet gun trough, 75 and White armored cowl ring. Upper wing and horizontal surfaces 70 Black

Green and 81 Brown Violet. Spinner: probably Black with White spiral. Prop Blades: 70 Black Green. Red/Yellow JG 301 RV bands.

"Yellow 8"; White II. Gruppe bar over bands.

**National Markings:** Fuselage; B4 800 mm Black crosses, H3 Hakenkreuz

Wings; Upper - B6 910 mm White crosses, Lower - B4 900 mm Black crosses.

**Stenciling:** Probably Factory Standard

**"Black 12"** Fw 190 A-8 W. Nr. 173943 Pilot: Unknown 2/JG 1 November 1944 Greifswald Germany

No antenna pulley on canopy. Round cover over primer filler hole on side of fuselage under cockpit. ETC 501 rack with E2 steel drop tank.

**Colors:** Undersurfaces, 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces, 75 Gray Violet; 74 Gray Green; Rust Red JG 1 RV band.

Small white dots on canopy and natural metal fuel access panel call attention to special fuel requirements. Spinner: Black with White spiral that continues on to propeller blades, see drawing. Prop Blades: 70 Black Green.

**National Markings:** Fuselage; B3 800 mm Black/White crosses, H2a Hakenkreuz

Wings; Upper - B6 910 mm White crosses, Lower - probably B3 900 mm Black/White crosses.

**Stenciling:** Factory Standard
