If modeling in 1/32 scale, the following **EagleParts** are recommended to accuize your Hasegawa Fw 190 kit: **EagleParts #45-32, Common Prop Blades and Spinner, EagleParts #48-32 Main tire and wheel, EP#49-32 Corrected Gun cowl, EP#51-32 Fw 190 A-8 Cockpit kit, and EP#52-32 Tail wheel**, Also **EP#21** in 48 or 32nd scale, appropriate **Drop Tank** is recommended for either the 190 or the 109. **EagleParts #20, EP#21, EP#23, EP#24, EP#25** are recommended for these Bf 109s in either 48th or 32nd scale.

"Yellow 17" Bf 109 G-6 III/JG 300 (III/JG 11 aircraft) Sept - Oct. 1943 Oldenburg, Germany

Pilot: Oblt. Gerhard Stamp. *Werknummer* unknown. Early head armor in cockpit, short antenna mast, DF loop antenna, FuG 25a intact. 20 mm underwing gun pods installed.

Colors: Under surfaces, Black; upper surfaces, originally RLM 75/RLM 74 over painted with very Dark Gray obliterating *Hakenkreuz* and most of fuselage cross. Use supplied templates for pattern to replicate over sprayed fuselage *Balkenkreuz*. Narrow Yellow JG 11 band on rear fuselage. Spinner: Black or very Dark Gray or possibly RLM 70. Propeller blades; RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage; Use supplied template; completely obliterated

Wings: Upper - 1000 mm B6 White outline crosses. Decal supplied but probably over painted or just slight amount of White cross showing through.

Lower - 900 mm Black with White outline crosses but mostly obliterated

Stencilling: completely over painted. Gold bomber pilot's clasp with exclamation point on port side of engine cowl. JG 11 Tiger's head under cockpit on both sides. Knight's cross with ribbon and three ship silhouettes on both sides of rudder.

"<<<" Bf 109 G-6 Stab I/JG 300 July 1944 Bad Wörishofen, Germany

Pilot: Hptm. Gerhard Stamp. *Werknummer* unknown. Early retrofitted Erla canopy with additional bracing on the slanted bulk head behind the pilot, see photo. Short antenna mast. DF loop, FuG 25a and FuG 16zy antennas all intact. Tall tail. Wide Dark Red JG 300 fuselage band with forward tip of the horizontal Black and White bar just visible in front of fuselage band.

Colors: Under surfaces, RLM 76 Light Blue; upper surfaces RLM 75/RLM 74. Spinner: RLM 70 with 1/3 portion of spinner back plate White. Propeller blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage; B3 900 mm Black with White outline crosses, 300 mm H2a Black *Hakenkreuz* with White outline.

Wings: Upper - B6 1000 mm White outline crosses

Lower - B2 900 mm Black and White with thin Black outline crosses

Stencilling: Factory standard.

"Green 3" Fw 190 A-6 Stab/JG 300 October 1943 Bonn-Hangelar, Germany

W. Nr. 550453, Pilot: Hptm. F.-K. Müller. No pilot armor in canopy. DF loop, FuG 25a antennas intact.

Colors: Under surfaces, RLM 76 Light Blue; upper surfaces RLM 75/RLM 74. Yellow undercowling.

Spinner and Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage; B2 800 mm Black White with Black outline crosses; H2a Black with White outline *Hakenkreuz*.

Wings: upper - B6 910 mm White outline crosses; Lower - B2 900 mm Black/White with thin Black outline crosses

Stencilling: Factory standard, *Stammkennzeichen* PT + XX on the underwings, see diagram in instructions. Two rows of victory bars on both sides of rudder.

"Green 1" Fw 190 A-6 Stab/JG Herrmann July-August 1943 Bonn-Hangelar, Germany

This Fw 190 A-6 was flown by the *Kommodore Major* Hajo Herrmann. No pilot armor in canopy. DF loop and FuG 25a antennas intact.

Colors: Under surfaces, RLM 76 Light Blue; upper surfaces RLM 75/RLM 74. Yellow undercowling.

Spinner and prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage; B2 800 mm Black White with Black outline crosses; H2a Black with White outline *Hakenkreuz*.

Wings: upper - B6 910 mm White outline crosses; Lower - B2 900 mm Black/White with thin Black outline crosses

Stencilling: Factory standard, one row of victory bars on both sides of rudder.
