"Yellow 9"

Pilot: Obfw. Alfred Grislawski. This aircraft was flown from 13 Sept to 28 Sept 1942 at Gonstakovka, USSR. He would score 6 confirmed victories in this aircraft. Staffel emblem under cockpit lacks the wife's name and Karaya,

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green heavily mottled on fuselage. Lower cowling, spinner and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow. Spinner backplate: RLM 70 Black-Green and White. Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B2 style 900mm Black/White crosses with thin Black outline.

Upper Wings: Upper: B6 style 1000mm White outline crosses.

Lower Wings: B2 style 900mm Black/White crosses. Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline.

Stenciling: Factory standard.

"Yellow 11" Bf 109 G-2 W.Nr. 13670 9-/JG 52 Sept. 1942 Pilot: Oblt. Hermann Graf. Flown from Tuzov in the USSR 4 Sept 1942. He would be credited with his 150th victory while flying this aircraft. Karaya Heart beneath cockpit with wife's name "Edda" in White.

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue, Uppersurfaces: RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green heavily mottled on fuselage. Lower cowling, spinner and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow. Spinner backplate: RLM 70 Black-Green and White. Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses.

Upper Wings: B6 style 1000mm White outline crosses. Lower Wings: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses. Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline.

Stenciling: Pactory standard.

Bf 109 F-4 W.Nr. 7034 9,/JG 52 25 Oct. 1941

USSR

Pilot: Uffz. Alfred Grislawski. Flown from Chaplinka, USSR from 25 Oct. to 10 Dec. 1941. He would claim one confirmed victory in this aircraft.

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green heavily mottled on fuselage. Cowling, spinner and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow. Spinner backplate: RLM 70 Black-Green and White. Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B2 style 900mm Black/White crosses with thin Black outline.

Upper Wings: B1a style 1000mm Black/White crosses with thin Black outline. Lower Wings: B2 style 900mm Black/White crosses with thin Black outline.

Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline.

Stenciling: Factory standard.

"Yellow 8" Bf 109 F-4 W.Nr. 7038 9,/JG 52 Oct. 1941

USSR

Pilot: Uffz. Alfred Grislawski. This aircraft was flown from 3 October to 23 Oct 1941, when the aircraft suffered from a seized engine and belly landed.

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: Heavily mottled RLM 70 Black-Green over original RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green. Cowling, spinner and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow. Photos seem to show that the theatre and aircraft ID markings are darker than the spinner and fuselage band. Spinner back plate: RLM 70 Black-Green. Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B2 style 900mm Black/white crosses with thin Black outline.

Upper Wings: B1a style 1000mm Black/White crosses with thin Black outline.

Lower Wings: B2 style 900mm Black/White crosses with thin Black outline.

Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline.

Stenciling: Factory standard.
