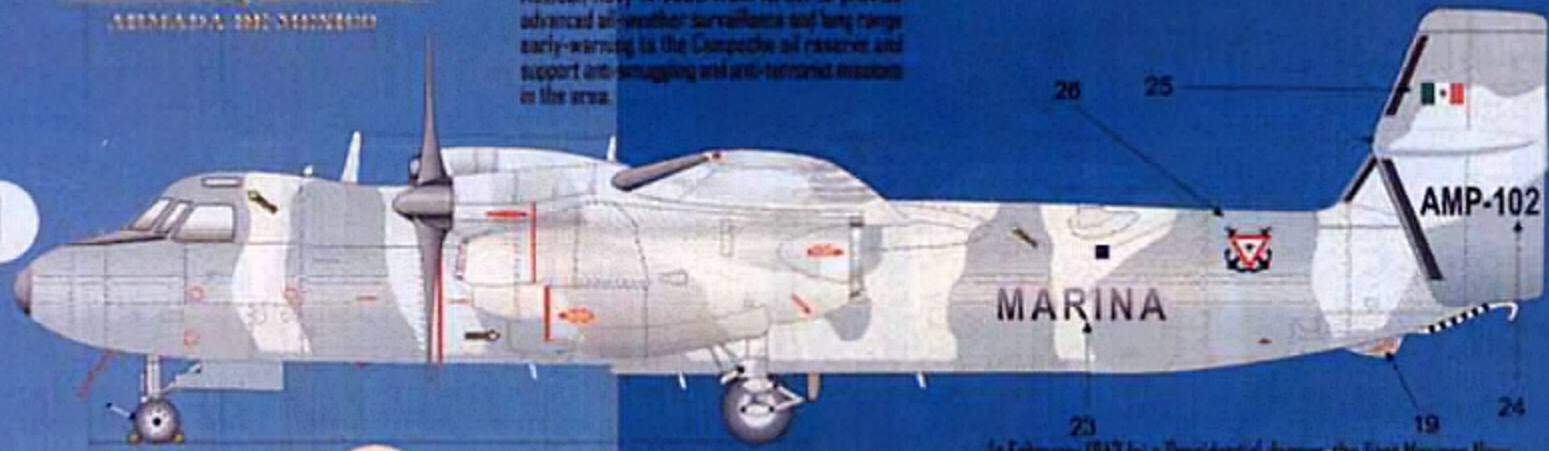
# Mexican Navy 1

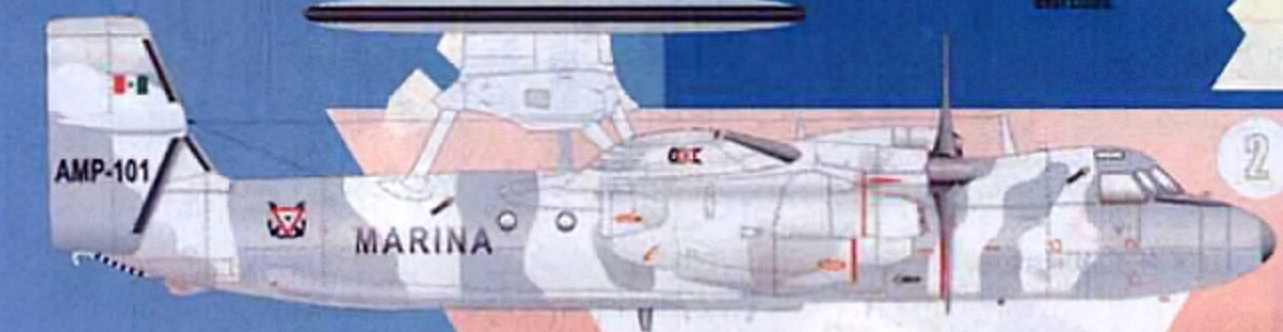

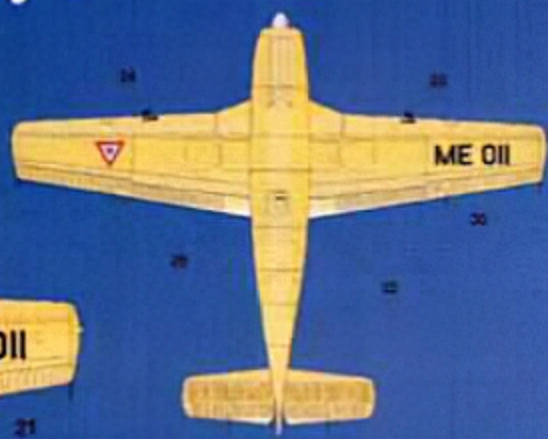
In February 1943 by a Presidential decree, the first Mexican Navy Air Squadron was created to face the threat of German U-boats operating in Mexican territorial waters. Since then, it has evolved to be one of the most modern and active Naval Air Arms of Latin America. Actually this is one of the major protagonists in UNITAS exercises.



# Mexican Navy 1



In order to improve the technical formation of Mexican naval aviators were acquired 3 Beechcraft T-34B (ME-OII to OIII). With good results because of the resistance and maneuverability Mexican Mustangs became one of the best prop trainers and predecessor of the turbo-prop T-34C. It serves until 1970s.



## Grumman Duck

In 1948, the Mexican Navy obtained three Grumman Duck flying boats (MV-07, 08 and 09) from the US for coastal patrol and surveillance duties. They were based at Veracruz until their destruction in the 1950s. The survivor (MV-08) was returned to US.

## North American AT-6 Corsair

Six Corsairs arrived at Balboa air field in March, 25th, 1942. These airplanes were acquired originally by Mexican Air Force and directed to Baja California in order to provide coastal patrol and surveillance. In February, 25th, 1943 was created the 1st Navy squadron at Armeria de Mexico. For that purpose were derivate the six operational Mexican AT Corsair. Served MV-01 to 06, were assigned at Tampico. At 1944 six a/c operated at Laz Bajandis airport (Veracruz). The survivor Mexican Corsair was returned to US, restored and exhibit at USS Alabama Battleship Memorial Park.
