

Currently one of only two airlines flying the Boeing 767 with Rolls Royce engines, Kumming based China Yunnan Airlines has been flying the 767 since 1996. China Yunnan's 767s can be seen throughout Asia and are a regular sight at Hong Kong. This decal was designed to fit the Hasegawa kit, however, Rolls Royce engines, not provided in the kit, are needed to finish the model with the correct engines. A good set of resin engines can be obtained from Braz models of Italy, or from AHS of Canada. Ambitious modelers may want to convert their own engines by using the Rolls Royce engines out of the Hasegawa 747 kit and grafting them onto the 767 pylon.

Paint the upper crown and tail gloss white. The belly and engines should be Boeing 707 gray. Paint the wings and horizontal stabilizers as shown in the drawings above. Apply the decals as shown above. It may be best to apply the stripes by starting at the nose and working aft. Center the peacock on the green tail with a narrow white border showing around it. Pay attention to the direction on the Cantonese titles as they differ on each side. Follow the instructions on the decal sheet itself. Due to the arrangement of the doors for China Yunnan, no over-wing escape routes are needed. Apply other decals as shown above and as indicated on the decal sheet.
