F4U-1D, VF-84, USS Bunker Hill, Feb. 1945. Aircraft overall Glossy Sea Blue, Prop hub Semi-Gloss Black. Note: front of cowling was painted Yellow for operations over the Japanese home islands. Area surrounding number on nose was left Glossy Sea Blue.



Exact position of right side not known.

F4U-1D of VMF-214 or -216, USS Wasp (CV-18); Feb. 1945 during the first strikes on Tokyo. Overall Glossy Sea Blue, Propellers were Black with Yellow tips. Note position of individual aircraft number on a gear door. Natural metal prop Hub.



Another Tokyo "first strike" veteran, this F4U-1D of VMF-112 [USS Bennington (CV-20), Feb. 1945] wore overall Glossy Sea Blue, Black propellers with Yellow tips and White individual aircraft number on each gear door. Yellow prop Boss. Flown by Major Herman Hanson.



F4U-1D, USS Franklin (CV-13), March 1945. Overall Glossy Sea Blue, Black propellers with Yellow tips. Note individual aircraft number shown on gear doors. Gloss Sea Blue propellers Hub and Boss.



F4U-1D, VBF-83, USS Essex (CV-9); April 1945. Glossy Sea Blue. Propellers were Black with Yellow tips. Prop Hub Gloss Sea Blue or Black.



F4U-1D, VBF-16, USS Wasp, October, 1945. Overall Glossy Sea Blue with Yellow prop boss.
