Early Mirage 5BA/BR aircraft were delivered with Martin Baker BRM Mk.4 seats. NOTE: Belgian Mk.4 seats were retrofitted with dual ejection handles on top, so check your reference carefully!

Prior to the outbreak of the first Gulf War the Mk.4s were replaced by the more modern Mk.10 ejection seat which is included in our kit.



Paint cockpit tub, side-walls and instrument panels **H B** Black, including the bulkhead behind the seat's headrest and avionic housings.

MB BRM Mk.4

Paint the metal frame of the Mk.4 ejection seat H® Black with parachute housing under the head rest in HU 163. Remaining cushions were HU 159 Khaki Drab. Shoulder and side belts in HU 81 Brownish Yellow. Middle main belt in Hu 66 Olive Drab. Other colours in use are Red, Yellow, White, Black and Aluminium.

MB Mk.10 Ejection Seats
Paint the metal frame of
the Mk.10 ejection seats
H B Black with head rest
and back rest cushions in a
mixture of HU 86 Light Olive and HU 155 Olive Drab.
The seat belts are HU 26
Khaki with pulls in HU 155
Olive Drab. The housing of
the rescue pack is painted
in HU 99 Lemon. Other
colors in use are Red, Yellow Hu 24, and White.





Paint intake trunks Mr. Hobby **H** 21 Off-white.

Remove fin on both kit parts.






During the late 1970s Belgian Mirages were upgraded with a more sophisticated RHAW gear. To depict a late version Mirage 5BA or BR, you need to remove the fin from the fuselage parts, and replace it by the tail section provided in resin (part number 28).


Make sure you cut carefully as illustrated in our instructions (horizontally NOT vertically), leaving a small mounting stage, which is needed to support our resin part.


For early version Mirage 5BA/BR aircraft use the original tail provided with the kit parts.





As the model might be a bit tail heavy with our resin wing tanks, exhaust and tail - add at least 80 to 100 grams of weight behind the cockpit.
























We provide two highly detailed 1,700 litre - auxiliary wing tanks, relevant for that period of time and exclusively carried by Belgian Mirages.



During the Cold War, Belgian Mirages were often seen carrying the seven-tube LAU-32 B/A rocket pod for training on the outer wing stations. These are provided in the kit and were painted HU 155 Olive Drab with fronts and ends in H8 Black.





In the wake of the Gulf War and the planned deployment of Belgian aircraft to Turkey, BAF Mirage 5BA were retrofitted with LAU-7 launch rails to carry the AIM-9P Sidewinder missiles for self-defence on both outer wing stations. Our kit provides the launch rails BUT NOT the Sidewinder missile itself. Belgian Mirages NEVER carried the Matra Magic missile.





• The well-known wrap around three-tone camouflage was introduced from 1981 onwwards. Before that Belgian Mirages were painted in the four-tone SEA camouflage with 'light aircraft grey' bottom.




- · We provide several stencils in two versions, some either black or white, red or yellow, or simply solid
- and with 'gaps'. These are marked by 'a' and 'b' on our decal sheet. Please check your reference carefully for which ones needed to be applied on your specific aircraft.
- The serial numbers for fighter-bombers were #001 to #063 (BA 01 to BA 63). Apply the serial below the tactical code on the tail in the following format (decal Type E) – $N^{\circ}001$ to $N^{\circ}063$.
- The serial numbers for recce-aircraft were #301 to #327 (BR 01 to BR 27). Apply the serial below the tactical code on the tail in the following format (decal Type 'E') – $N^{\circ}301$ to $N^{\circ}327$.

• There are two versions of the 'BA/BR' code (decal Type 'A' or 'B'). Type 'B' could only be found on some earlier aircraft, while Type 'A' was the common one – check your reference carefully!


































Mirage BA/BR single-tone dark green wrap around 1,700 I tank







- It is known that several paint schemes existed for the Mirage fuel tanks. All Mirage 5BA/BR aircraft started to receive a three-tone wrap around scheme from 1981. The wrap around scheme was adopted for the fuel tanks as well, however, only during major overhauls. Thus, all kinds of different paint configurations could be found on BAF Mirages during the 1980s. Also the stencils varied from tank to tank – so, check your photos and reference carefully.
- Decals #118, #119 and #120 have to be applied facing outward from the aircraft not inward!
