

Panhard VBL (short wheelbase) in international service

The Hellenic Army acquired its first 13 short wheelbase VBLs in 1997, as an urgent operational requirement due to its commitments to IFOR in Bosnia and operation ALBA in Albania. These vehicles came from a batch ordered by the French army and were identical to French army vehicles. They were finished in French three tone camouflage and carried all factory applied

French markings, which they retained in Greek service with

the addition of Hellenic
Army number plates.
These early vehicles
served both in Albania as
part of the FMP forces and
in Kosovo with the Greek
KFOR contingent. FMP
vehicles often had an
orange air recognition
panel fixed to their









NOTE: Where markings provided on the kit decal sheet are to be used they are indicated by **(3)**.

NOTE: Marking 4 was only seen on a few vehicles, possibly indicating the presence of an interpreter.





When the VBLs were repatriated they retained their colours but without the mission specific markings.



After 2005 tyre pressure markings were added in at least two versions. Also tactical sign holders were added to the front doors.

NOTE: The tactical sign holders and the relevant markings are available in sets LM 35010, LM 35010-2 and LMA 35001.


PORTUGAL



Portugal was the first country after France to adopt the Panhard VBL, where it is known as the M-11. The first 14 vehicles were delivered in 1987. The M-11 was used operationally in the Balkans. Portuguese M-11s are armed with a Browning M-1919 machine gun on the commanders position. They are finished in a uniform olive green colour common to all Portuguese army vehicles.






Indonesian VBLs are finished in a four-colour camouflage pattern of greenish sand, chocolate brown, green and black which seems to be standard on all vehicles. They are armed either with a Browning M-1919 or an M-60 machine gun on the commanders position.
