

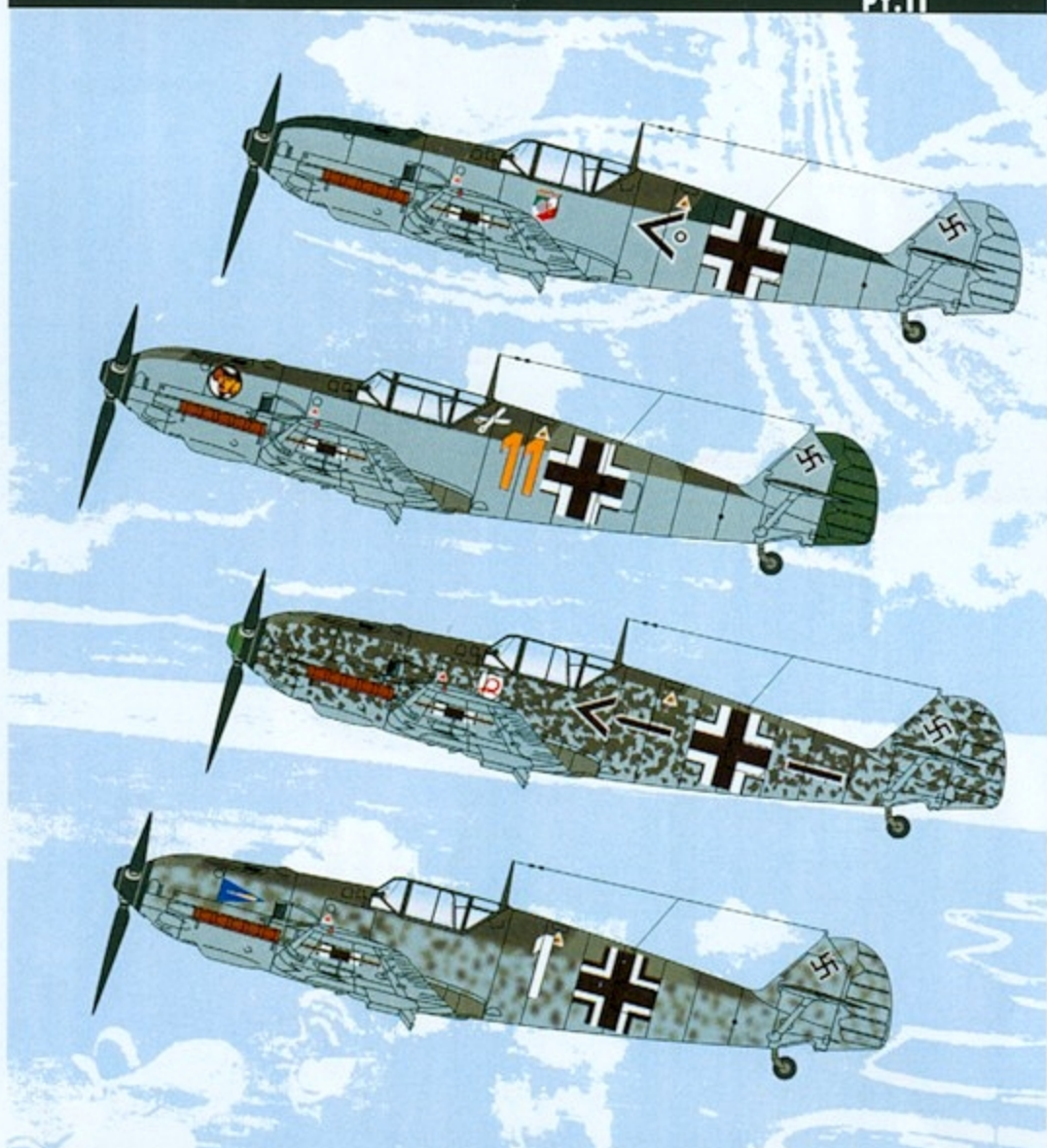

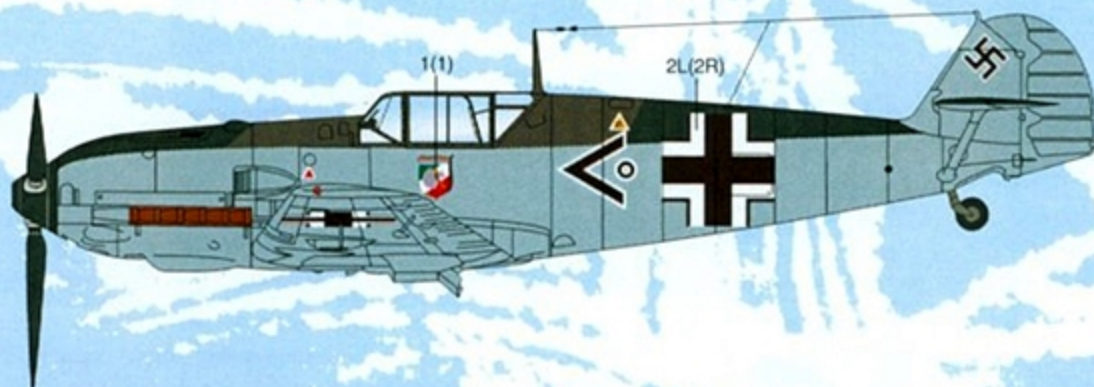

Suggested Kit: Hasegawa/Tamiya/HobbyCraft, Messerschmitt Bf 109 Family.

Bf 109E-3 III/JG51

Oblt. Werner Pichon-Kalau von Hofe, Technical Officer, mid-summer 1940. This aircraft carries the III Gruppe 'Axt von Niederrhein' insignia and an unusually small circle to the Gruppe Technical Officer chevron. Upper camouflage is the earlier RLM 70/71 scheme.



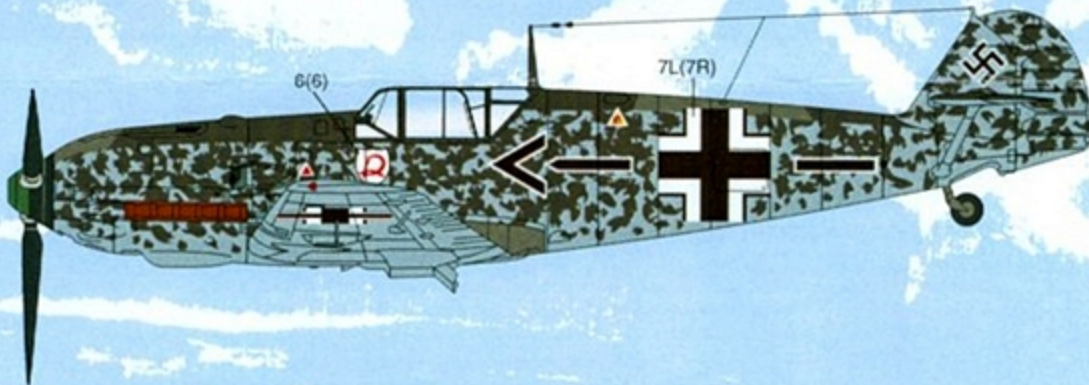
Note unusual position of fuselage cross.

Bf 109E-3 'Yellow 11' I/JG27
Oblt. Werner Schuller, Plumetot, July 1940.

This aircraft carries a replacement rudder still painted in factory primer. Note also the White scissors in honour of a 3. Staffel colleague, Lt. Ulrich Scherer, KIA 20 July.

Bf 109E-3 Stab/JG2

Maj. Harry von Bülow-Bothcamp, Geschwaderkommodore of JG2. This aircraft carries a heavily stippled style of camouflage and 'Richthofen' insignia below the cockpit. Von Bülow-Bothcamp, a WWI veteran, would later lose command of JG2 as part of Goering's reorganisation of Luftwaffe commanding officers.

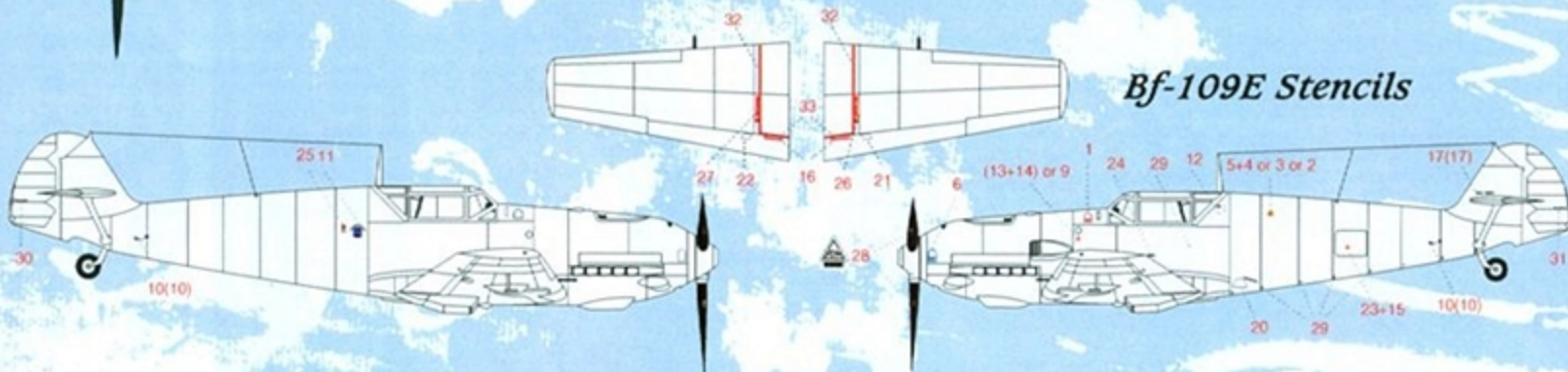


Bf 109E-4 'White 1' 3/JG2

Finished in RLM 02/71 scheme with heavy mottling in the same colours. Without the Richthofen Geschwader insignia, this JG2 aircraft wears the Blue and Yellow 'Horrido' pennant. Note also the extra Black thickening on the Balkenkreuz White borders to reduce its visibility.

Standard Factory Stencils for the early BF-109 B-C-D-E Family. Take into consideration that not all were used on operational A/C, specially after Field repairs and painting.
