Color and marking notes:

The IRIAF F-5E/F fleet wears faded standard Asia Minor camouflage as applied on delivery. During the long service years, maintenance markings were reduced to a minimum and now only very few stencils can be seen on the airframes.

Weapon load:

The standard combat load of IRIAF F-5Es and Fs consisted in a centreline fuel tank and 2 AIM-9P AAMs.

For CAS missions 4 BLU-27 napalm tanks were also frequently used early during the war against Iraqi ground formations, but were largely replaced by 4 Mk.82SE bombs with Snakeye retarding fins during later stages of the conflict.


Sometimes 4 LAU-3 unguided rocket pods were also carried.


F-5E/F Tiger II / Azarakhsh

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


F-5E 73-00939 / 3-7059, 21st TFS, Islamic Iranian AF, TFB.2 Tabriz, 1984.
This Tiger II was credited with at least 3 victories during the Iran-Iraq War. It was also the favourite mount of Col. Javadpour, who downed 2 IrAF Su-20s when flying this jet. For most of the war, IRIAF F-5Es were relegated to air-to-ground missions, but, in June 1986, Col. Javadpour managed to intercept and damage an Iraqi MiG-25PDS returning from a mission deep within Iranian airspace.




F-5E 3-7301, 41st TFS, Islamic Iranian AF, TFB.4 Vahdati, 2010.
The oldest F-5E in Iranian service and an Iran-Iraq War veteran, 3-7301 was stored for more than 15 years and returned to service after an overhaul in 2007. Squadron markings, in form of a bald eagle head, were applied on the starboard tail side of the 41st TFS F-5Es in October 2009.

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F-5F 75-00682 / 3-7155, 43rd TFS, Islamic Iranian AF, TFB.4 Vahdati, 2010.
3-7155 was only the second F-5F build for Iran, The jet flew dozens of combat missions during the Iran-Iraq War and served with the 41st TFS from 1976 until 2009, when it was reassigned to the 43rd TFS. The 43rd TFS nickname being "The Tigers", all the units F-5E and Fs now wear tiger head insignia on the starboard side of their fins.



F-5E Azarakhsh 3-7361, 41st TFS, Islamic Iranian AF, TFB.4 Vahdati 2010.
3-7361 is one of the few F-5Es modified under Project Azarakhsh, lauched in the 1990s by HESA with the intention of upgrading the aircraft's cockpit layout, fire control system, avionics and armament. The most noticeable external differences are the deletion of the starboard nose gun as well as RWR antennas and chaff/ flares dispensers on the rear fuselage.
