

## VOUGHT F4U-4 CORSAIR

1/48 Scale

Of all the American fighters used in World War II, one of the most distinctive and most feared was the Vought F4U Corsair. Distinctive in both shpe and sound, the Japanese called the gull-winged fighter the "Whistling Death" because of the sound made by the wind rushing through the air intakes in the wings. No doubt the rapid staccato of the the Corsair's four 20 mm cannon also evoked fear in its enemies as well.

Following the war, development of the Corsair continued and newer models were introduced into service. Among the types operational at the outbreak

of the Korean war was a more powerful version, the F4U-4. A 2,450 hp Pratt & Whitney R-2,800 Double Wasp pushed the big fighter to a speed of more than 450 mph.

During the Korean war, Corsairs were able to carry up to 4,000 lbs of bombs, and the formerfighter became a very effective ground-attack plane. The first F4U-1 Corsair flew on May 29, 1940. By December, 1952, the last of 12,571 of the planes was delivered, making the fighter one of the most prolific American planes to defend our skies.


