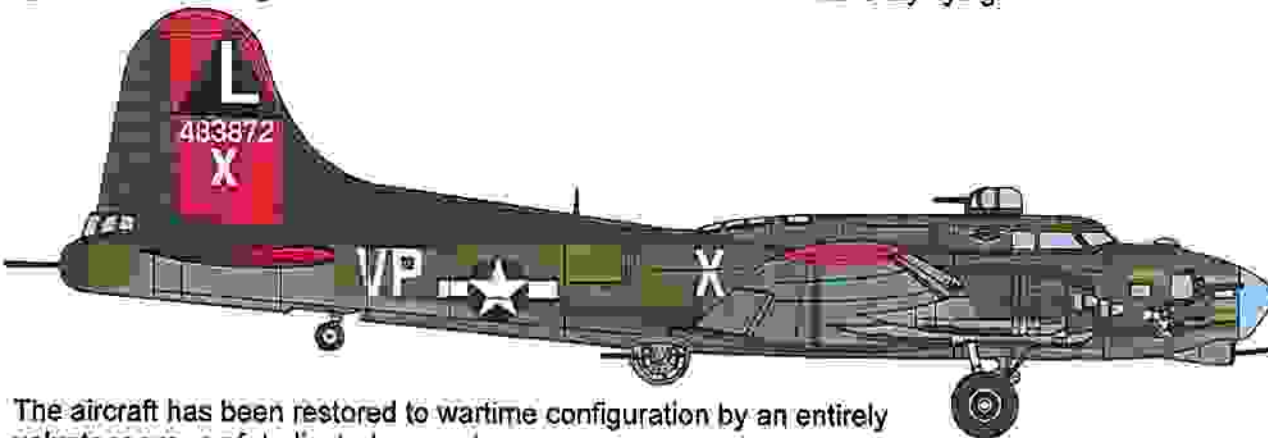




B-17G-95-DL 44-83872 VP-X 'Texas Raiders' 'L' CAF

The aircraft has been restored to wartime configuration by an entirely volunteer group of dedicated supporters.

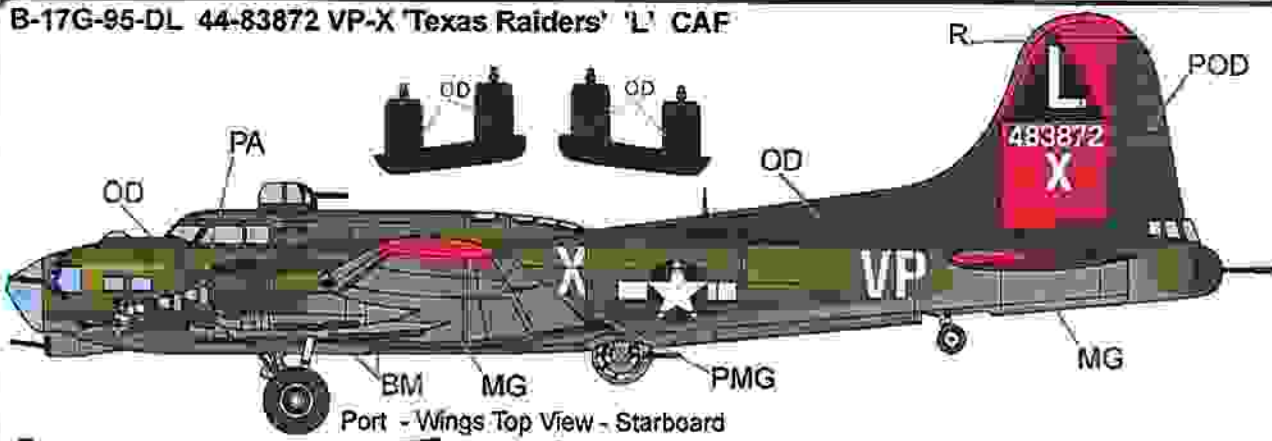
B-17G-110-VE 44-85829 GD-Y 'Yankee Lady' YAF

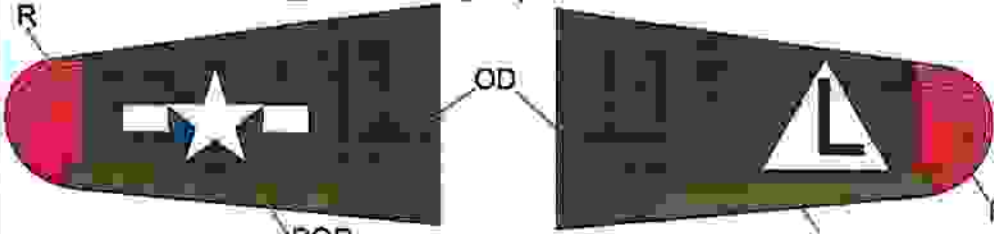


This color scheme is a memorial to the late Joseph Slavik who flew 35 missions as a pilot with the 381st.

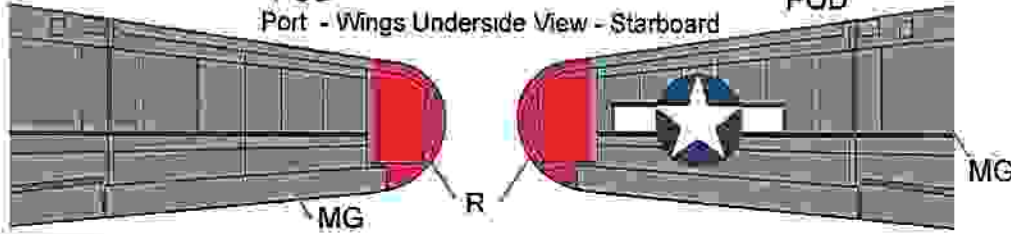

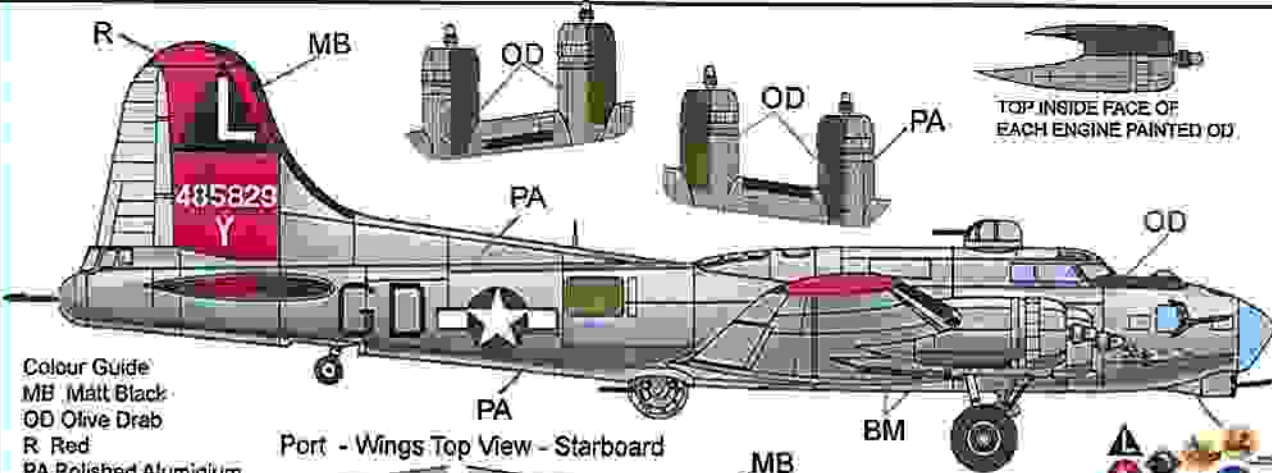
Port - Wings Top View - Starboard



Port - Wings Underside View - Starboard

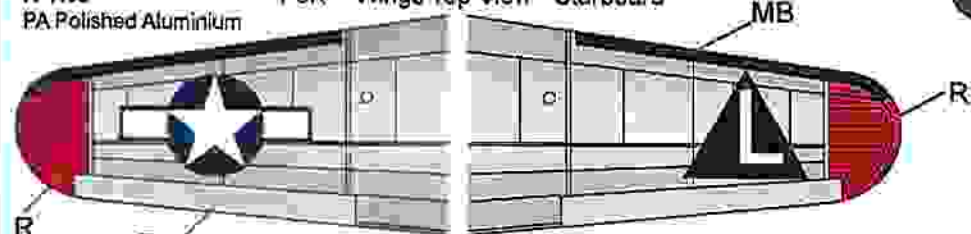

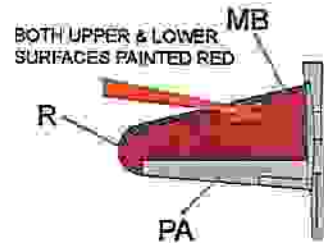
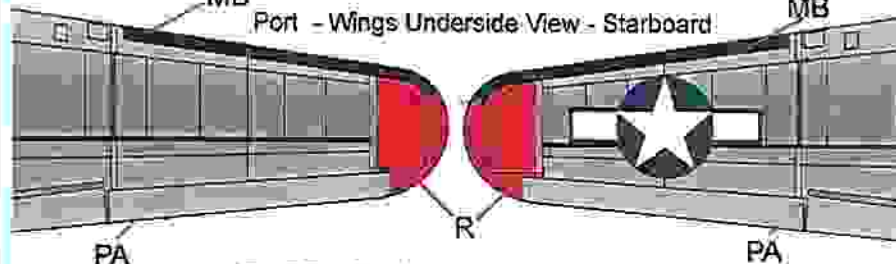
