Multi-Media Model Kit ACRK48-19

1. This kit has been designed with the modeler in mind and although not an ideal model for the novice, this model should be well suited to those modelers wanting to try a resin kit.
2. Please study the instructions carefully and prepare the parts with care. To remove the parts from casting blocks and or to remove casting flash from the resin parts (grey or clear) use a good razor saw or a sharp new scalpel.
3. This kit should pose no real problems for assembly once the parts have been prepared, consult the drawings included.
4. This particular Spitfire has caused many debates over the years especially the colours, what was fitted how and when. Hopefully we have covered as many bases as possible and would encourage all to do their own research and to finish the model how they wish in respect to colours used internally and externally. The canopies can be removed from casting stubs with careful use of a saw or sharp knife, and the edges can be filed carefully. The canopies will be enhanced if you dip them in 'FUTURE'.

General

Please wash all parts in warm soapy water. Any parts that would benefit from slight straightening or small adjustments to the shape can be placed in HOT running tap water and with care the modeler can reshape the part.

Resin parts only glue with super glues or epoxy glue. A mask should be worn when sanding resin parts.

To fill resin use "Super Glue" or "Milliput", as these are better fillers to use with resin products. Avoid using styrene fillers, such as "Green Stuff".

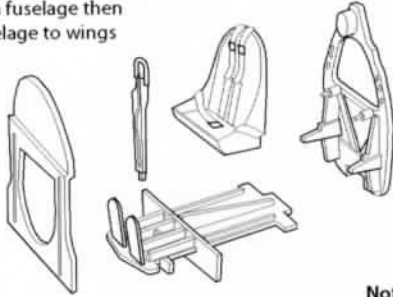
This kit is intended for modelers with some modeling experience and is not suitable for children. There are sufficient parts to complete one model.

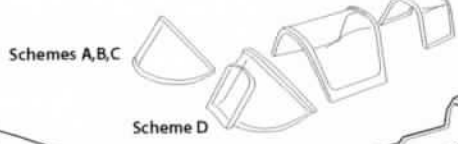

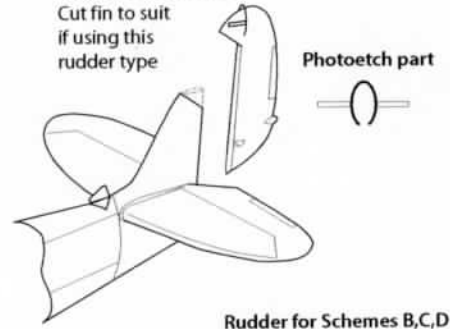
Construct cockpit sub-assembly, affix within fuselage then mate fuselage to wings



Note option for front cockpit screen

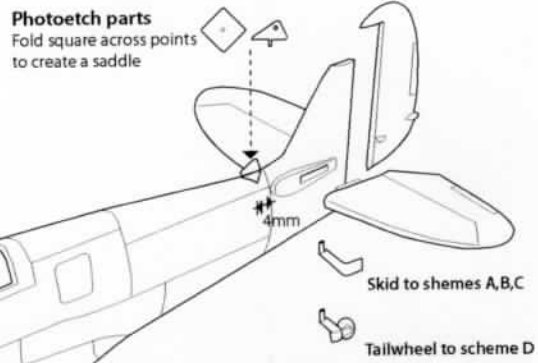


Rudder for Scheme A

Rudder for Schemes B,C,D

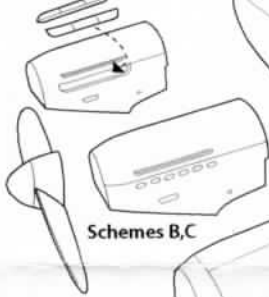
Photoetch parts

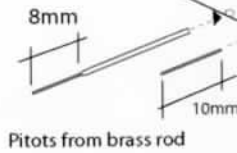

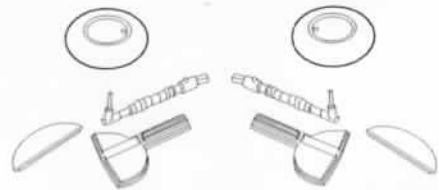
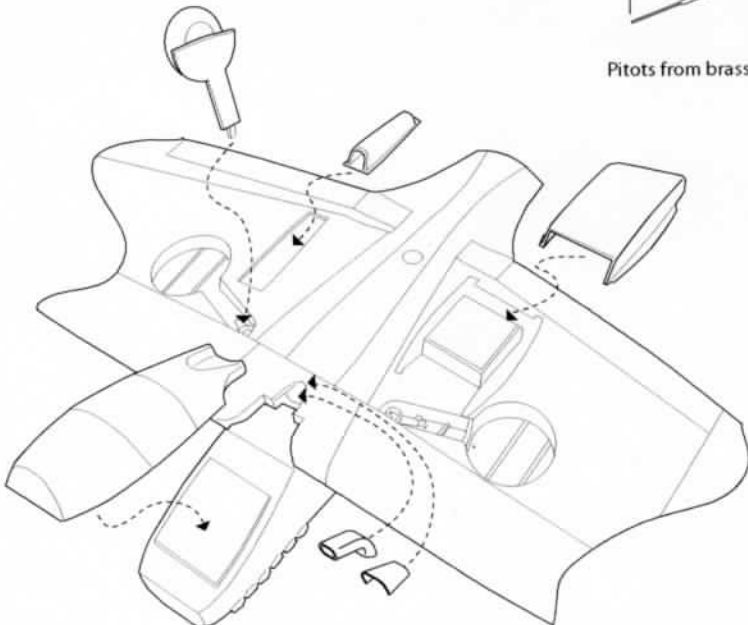

Engine cowling options

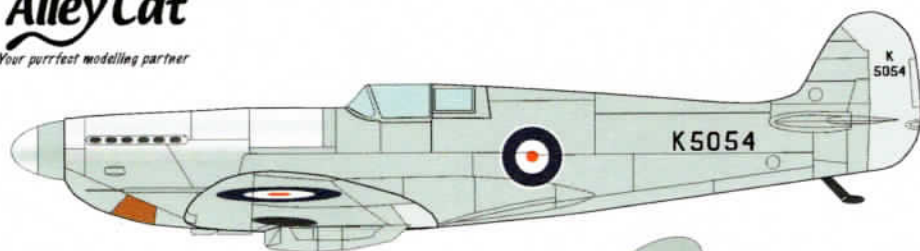


Pitots from brass rod



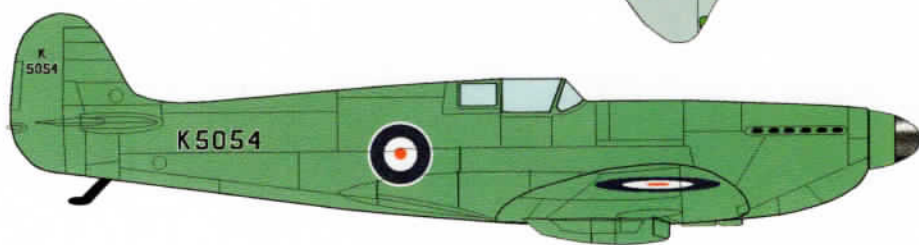
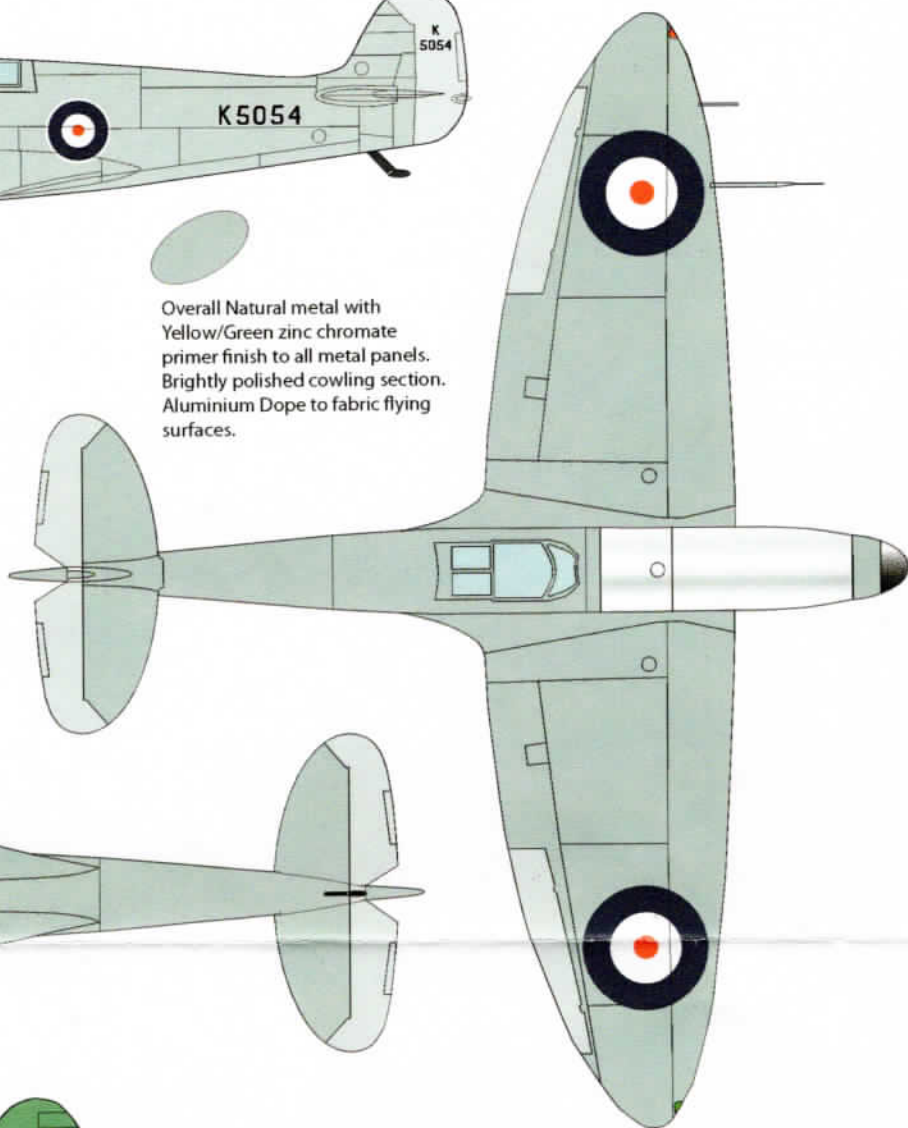
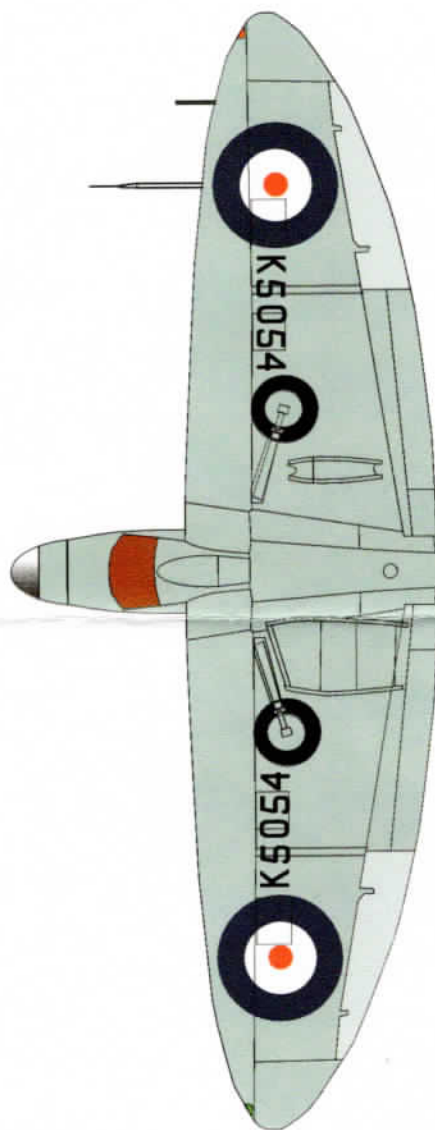
Undercarriage door options

K5054, Eastleigh Airport, 05 March 1936

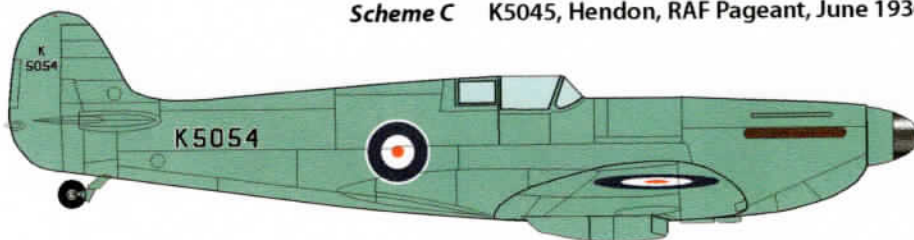

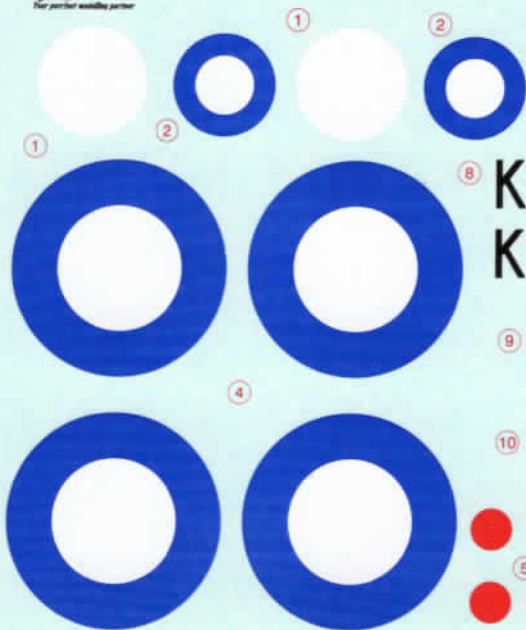
Scheme C K5045, Hendon, RAF Pageant, June 1936
