



B-17F 42-29673 JJ-S 365BS 305BG Chelveston May 1943




Capt. Bruce Bairnsfather painted "Old Bill" whilst she was in for repair April 1943

Purchased as surplus from the military inventory for a mere \$750 in 1946, the airplane has flown more than 1 million miles. It has served as a cargo hauler, an aerial mapping platform and in pest control and forest dusting applications.



The final mission for "Old Bill" was on the 15th May 1943, and was described in the 422 Bomb Squadron Diary "The mission for today is Whilhelmshaven for a third maximum effort in three days, weather over the target was poor. A Target of Opportunity presented itself in the Heligoland Islands off Whilhelmshaven and our bombs found the target. Before altitude was reached 60 fighters and 10 bombers attacked the composite group in the biggest encounter to date with the enemy. With no escort the groups gunners withstood all attacks.
