Flown by Lt. Heindl, Adjutant of Stab II/JGS-4

March-April 1941, Arad, Romania.

Aircraft code "small 5" indicates

fifth aeroplane in Stab flight.

The camouflage pattern visible through the yellow paint on the engine cowling.





Messerschmitt Bf 109 E-4

I/JG 51, early August 1940, Northern France.

The aircraft is in typical camouflage of RLM 71/02, with fuselage sides painted in various camouflage patterns. Forward fuselage was, according to photographs, almost certainly white, being very rare recognition markings used during operation "Adlerangriff". Wing tips and the rudder were dark yellow and some of the camouflage spots were visible through the yellow paint. Spinner was painted RLM 70.

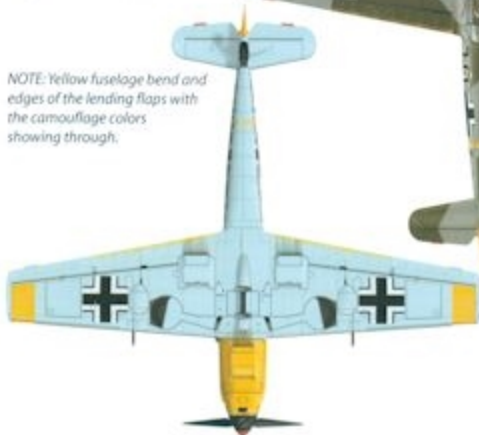
Battle of Britain, crash landed on August 12, 1940 near Margate, Kent

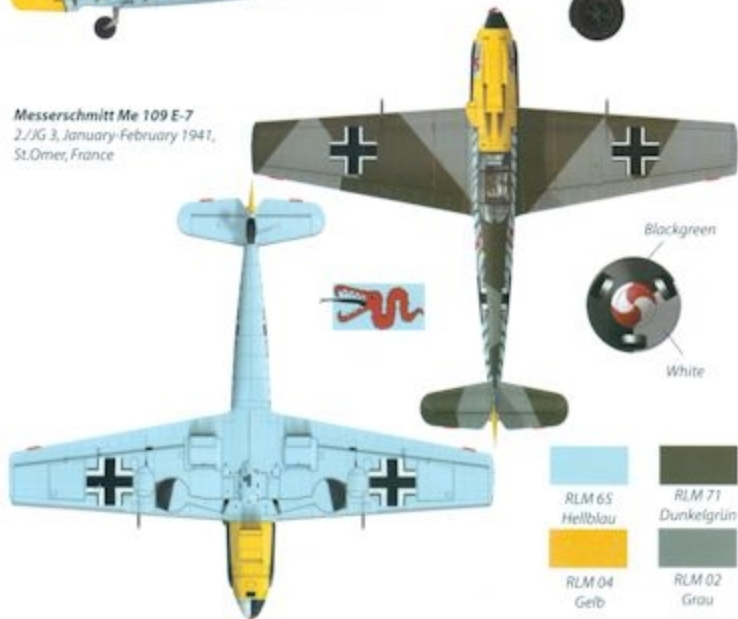



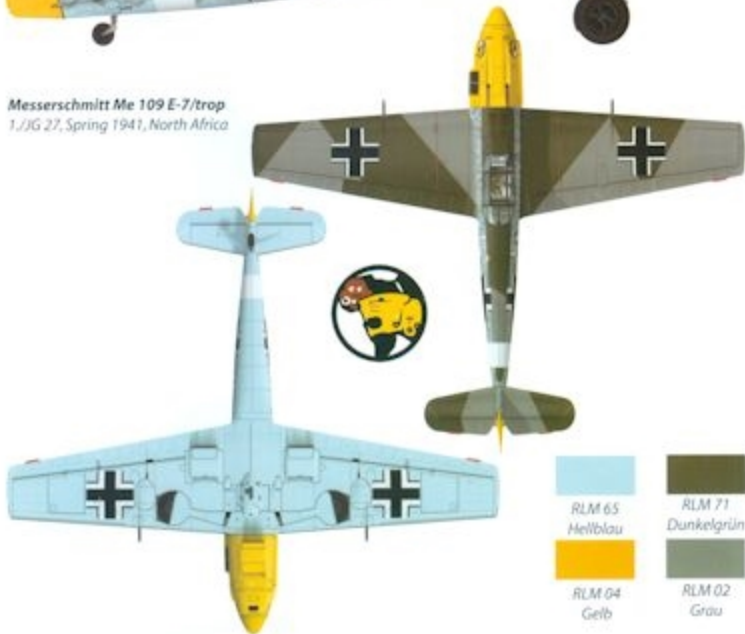
