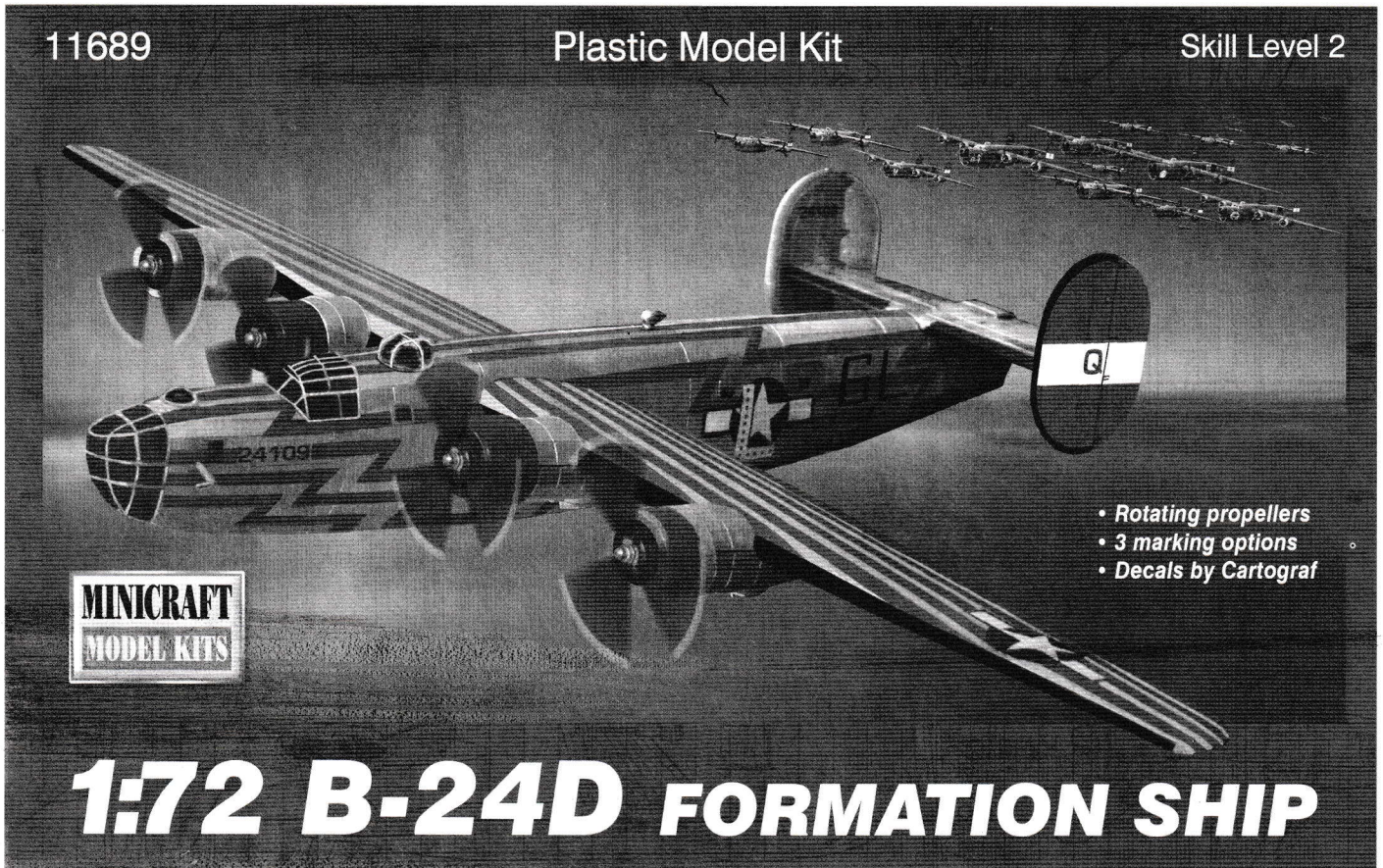

The B-24 Liberator was used in every theatre of operation in World War II and produced in greater quantities than any other aircraft in history. The B-24 evolved through its service life beginning as a heavy maritime patrol bomber. It was the longest-range heavy bomber in United States inventory during much of WWII.

The United States Army Air Force introduced the concept of daylight strategic bombing early in World War II. The strategy was designed to destroy enemy armament production and raw materials needed to conduct modern warfare. The B-24 was one of 2 principle aircraft used. The B-24D was the early version of the B-24 that served in all theatres of operation during WWII.

This model kit represents the United States Army Air Force B-24D formation ship. Formation ships were decorated in distinctive markings to assemble bombing formations before the flight into hostile territory. This new kit features new markings and decals representing 2 unique formation ships.

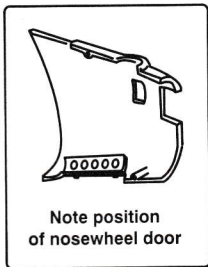

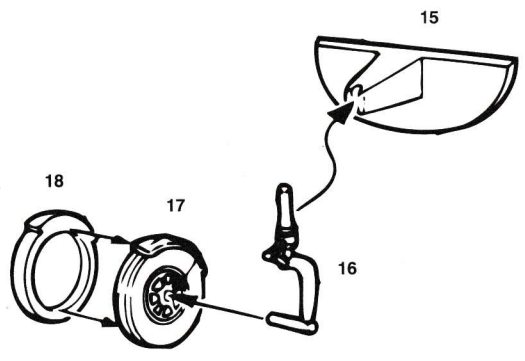

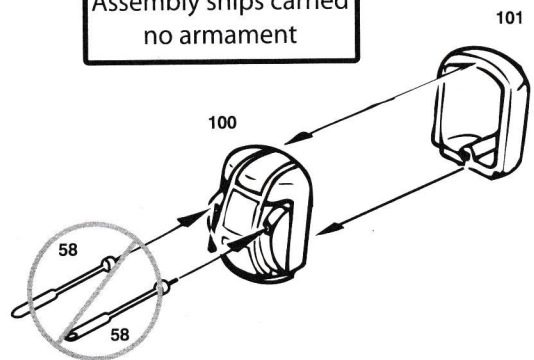

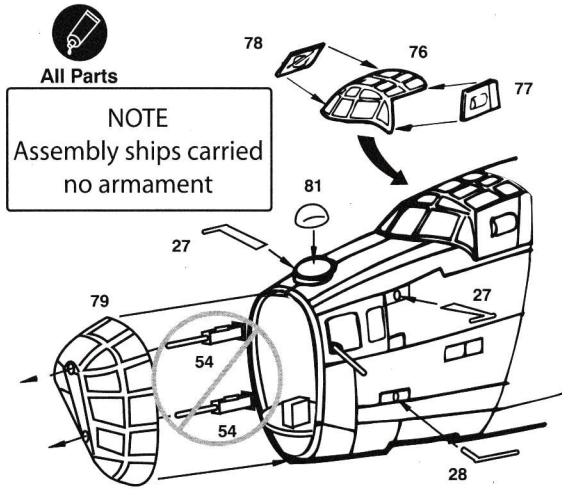

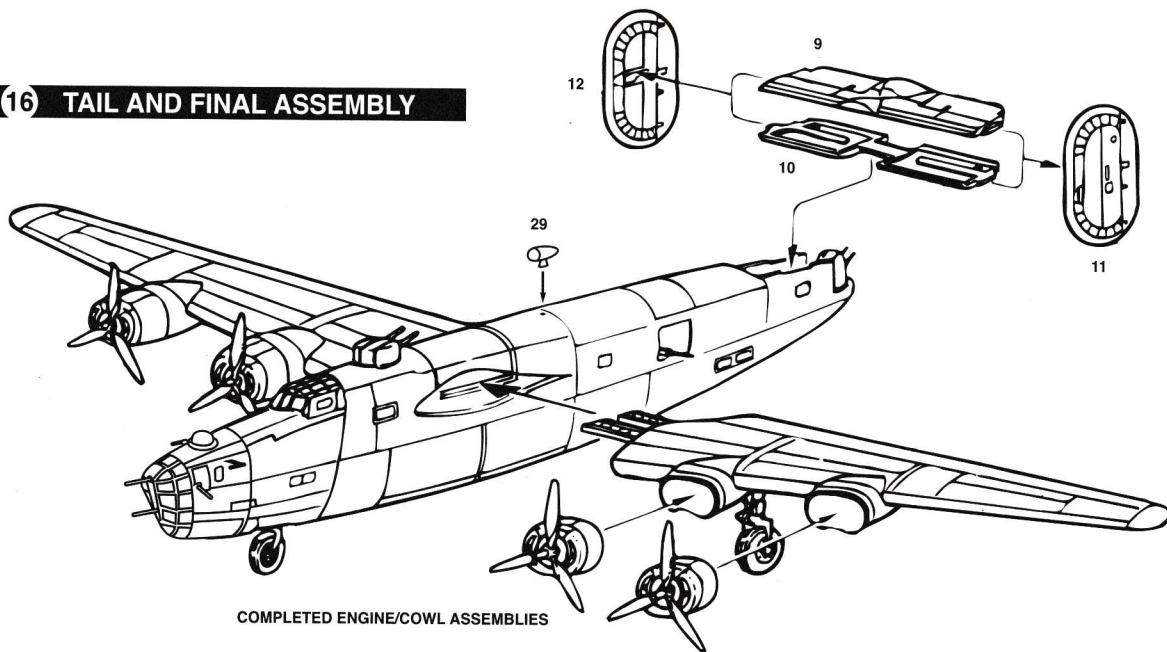
15 LEFT AND RIGHT WING ASSEMBLY

- Superchargers/exhausts DULL RUST



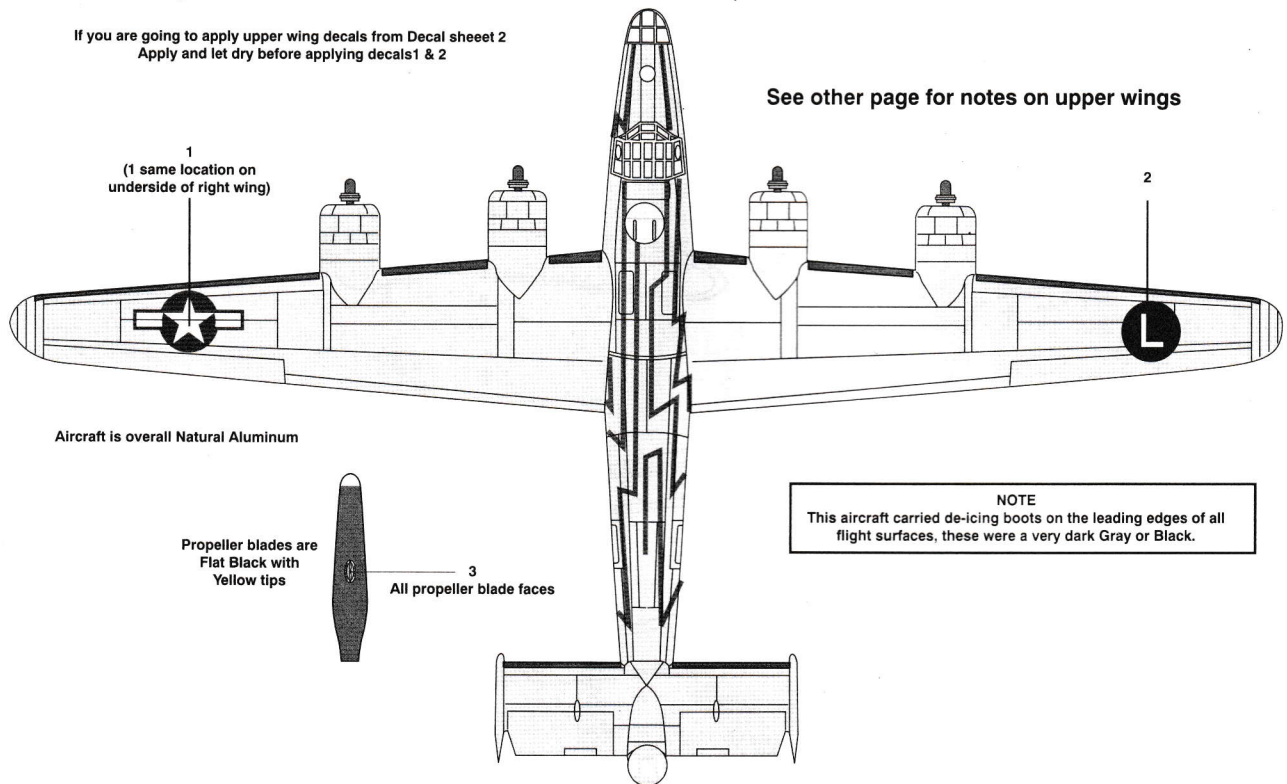

Special note for "Silver Streak"

Various references indicate "Silver Streak" initially carried no wing stripes. Several artistic impressions suggest it may have carried a series of zig-zag stripes on the upper wing on the early version. Photographs indicate the late version at one time carried a series of horizontal stripes from wing root to wing tip. We have provided decals for the later version.

For the earlier version, we have provided a template on the back page.

These templates are provided at size for the advanced modeler to mask and paint the variations of upper wing stripes if desired.

Decal Application:

Your Minicraft model includes high-quality waterslide decals. These decals adhere best to a glossy surface.

Use a sharp scissors or knife to cut individual decals from the carrier sheet.

Do not cut into the clear film surrounding the individual decals.

It is recommended that you apply one decal at a time.

Place the decal section in warm water, when first inserted in the water your decal will curl, after approximately ten seconds the decal will uncurl.

Remove from water and lay on a paper towel.

After approximately 10 - 20 seconds the decal will slide freely from the backing paper.

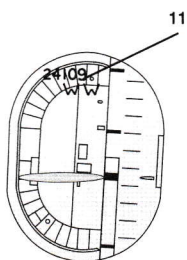
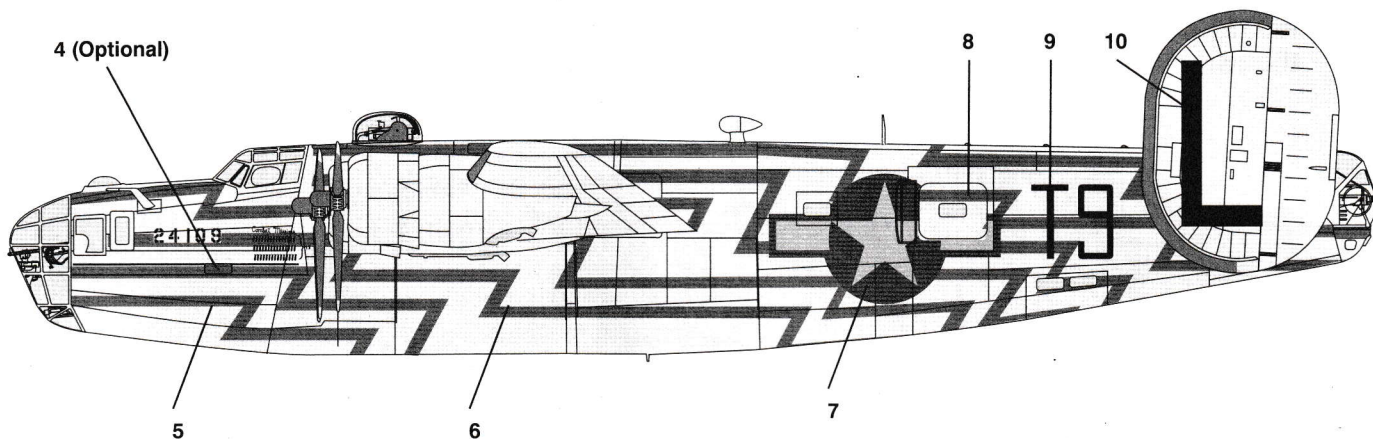
Use a small brush to help slide the decal from the backing paper and into position on the model.

Carefully blot excess water from the decal, using care not to move the decal or tear it.

If you choose to use a setting solution, apply a thin coat over the decal following the manufacturer's instruction.

Allow the decal to dry overnight. Wash any adhesive residue off the model with a small wet towel.

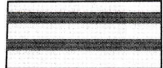


Inside Starboard (Right) tail

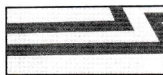

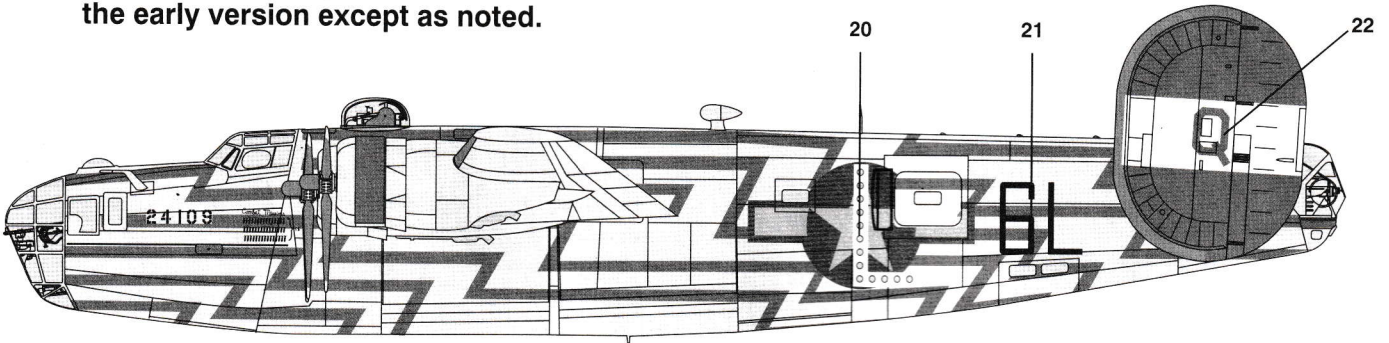


IMPORTANT!

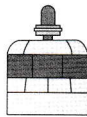
Fuselage decals for "Silver Steak" are in three parts per side. Start with the middle decal (Right side 14, Left side 6). Use plenty of water or mild decal solution to allow the decal to 'float' into position. Carefully slide the decal to align with the thin outline of the wing root opening. Then apply the forward and rear decal, aligning the stripes to the center decals. It is best to cut the decals from the sheet and familiarize yourself with the alignment before dipping them in water.
