





"Yellow 4." a Bf109F-4 of 9./JG3 flown by ObFwbl. Eberhard von Boremski, May, 1942. With 74 confirmed victories, von Boremski ranked among the Luftwaffe's most successful enlisted-man pilots. His machine probably wears a field-applied scheme of RLM 79 Sandgelb, RLM 82 or 80 Dunkelgrün and RLM 75 Grauviolett over RLM 78 Lichtblau. Note the RLM 70 Schwarzgrün spinner, as well as the RLM 04 spinner tip, cowl chin, fuselage band and lower wing tips. However, combination could have been 70/02/79 over 78 or 79/80/74 over 78, our choice. Upper surface pattern unknown.

freshly painted replacement) oil cooler lower


cowling area. Yellow rudder. Black wing roots.

Me109 F-2 of Hptm. Hans Von Hahn (score 34) 1./JG3 Summer of 41, Russia. A/C wears a unique camouflage of 74/75/76, with rings over the fuselage and vertical tail surfaces. Black wing roots. Nobody knows for certain the color of these rings, but 71 or 74 are a good educated guess. The Yellow cowling was splotched on the top and sides in possibly 74/02. To create a good effect apply the Green Tatzelwürm first, and then mottle the cowling, leaving a Yellow surround and background to this badge. Use moderation. We have never seen a picture of the spinner, but the reference shows it with a Green and White spiral on the front 1/3 portion. We are providing you two spiral choices. one Green/White and one with only White, allowing the RLM 70 color to show through. Your choice.
