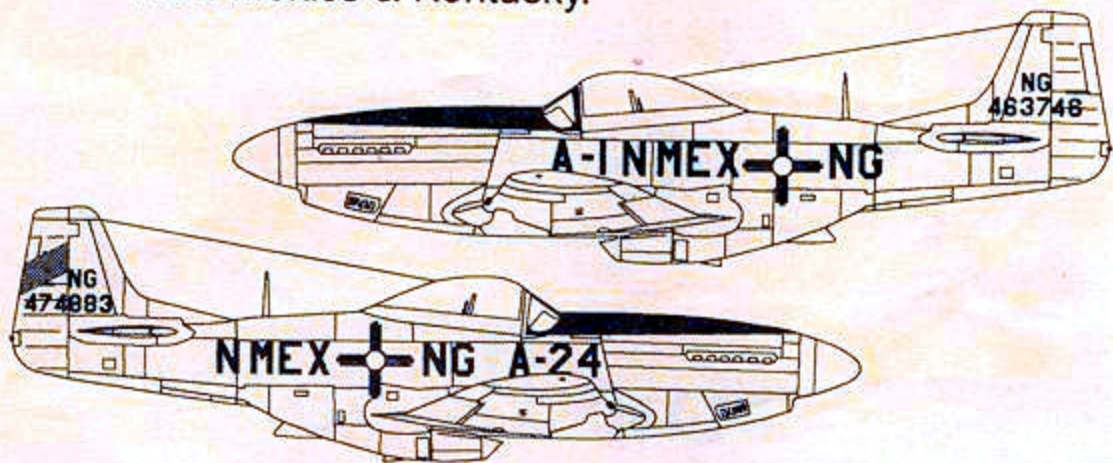

## New Mexico ANG Mustangs

"A-1" and "A-24" were P-51D's of 188 Squadron New Mexico ANG. The State's symbol replaced National insignia on the fuselage sides.

"A-1" was natural metal. Our references indicate a weathered, dulled surface, a "shadow" indicating the size and shape of the previous fuselage national marking.

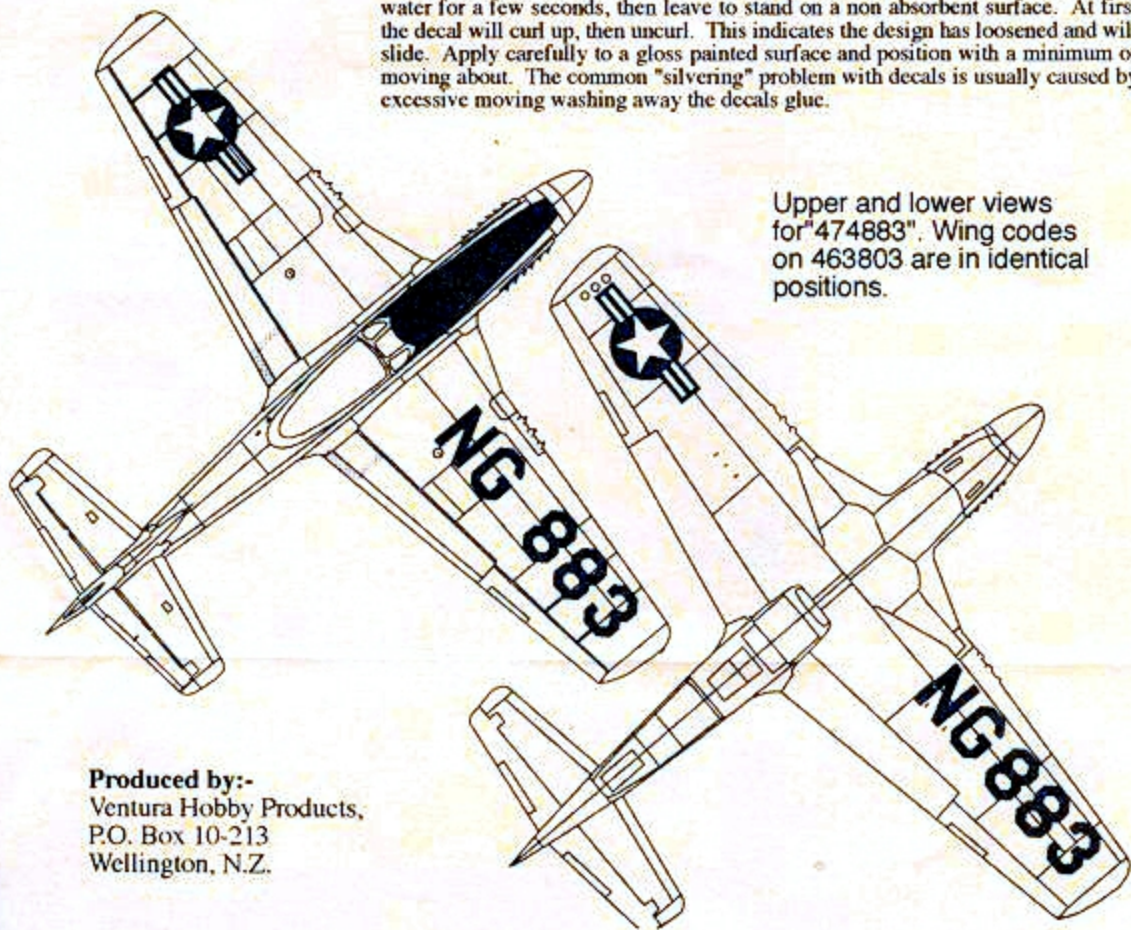
"A-24" was painted silver with photographs showing the aircraft in pristine condition. Both aircraft had natural metal spinners and black anti-glare panels.

## General Instructions

Ventura Decals are printed thinly for a painted on look. Dip each design into water for a few seconds, then leave to stand on a non absorbent surface. At first the decal will curl up, then uncurl. This indicates the design has loosened and will slide. Apply carefully to a gloss painted surface and position with a minimum of moving about. The common "silvering" problem with decals is usually caused by excessive moving washing away the decals glue.

Upper and lower views for "474883". Wing codes on 463803 are in identical positions.
