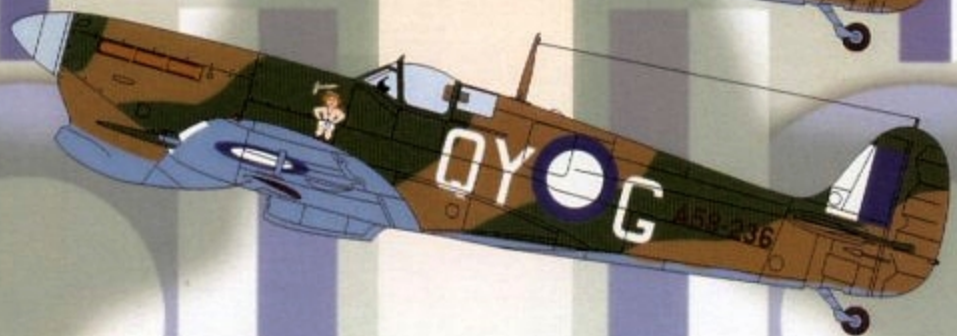
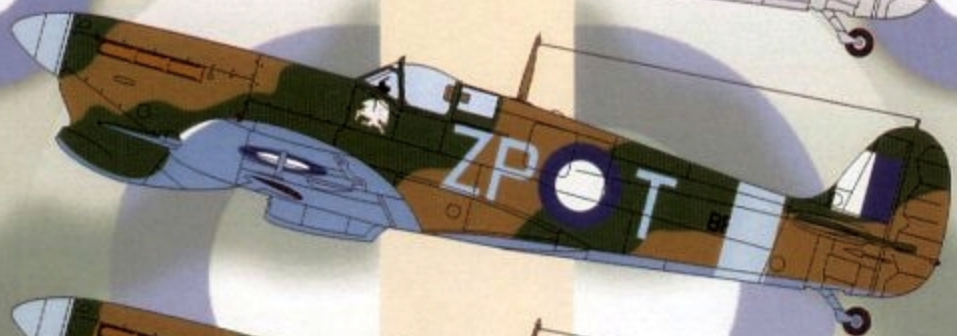

Spitfire Mk.Vc A58-250 SH-K 'Marge'
85 Squadron RAAF, Pearce, Western Australia, 1945. 85 Squadron received re-furbished aircraft from other squadrons converting to Spitfire Mk.VIII. SH-K is depicted at the time when bare metal finish was being introduced.



Scrap front views of nose sections appear for each aircraft carrying a code letter on the chin. Also positioning of starboard codes and roundels are shown for each aircraft in dotted line form.

Spitfire Mk.Vc BR543 ZP-T

Flt. Lt. J. Newton 457 Squadron RAAF, Livingstone, Northern Territory, Australia, 1943. ZP-Ts original camouflage scheme of Mid Stone/Dark Earth/Azure Blue has been adapted for the Far East theatre by overpainting the Mid Stone with Foliage Green. Flt. Lt. Newton's personal marking of a white Pegasus is shown below the cockpit.



BR543 ZP-T & BS219 ZP-X

Note the different spacing of the code letters on starboard side.

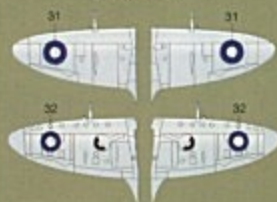

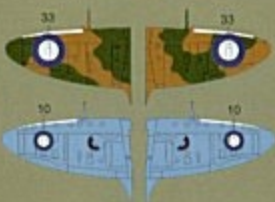
Spitfire Mk.Vc, QY-G/A58 236
"Junior" of 452 Squadron, at Darwin, mid 1943. Flown by Pilot Officer "Junior" Beaton. Colors as per A/C 2.



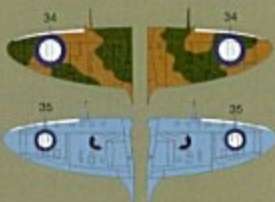
