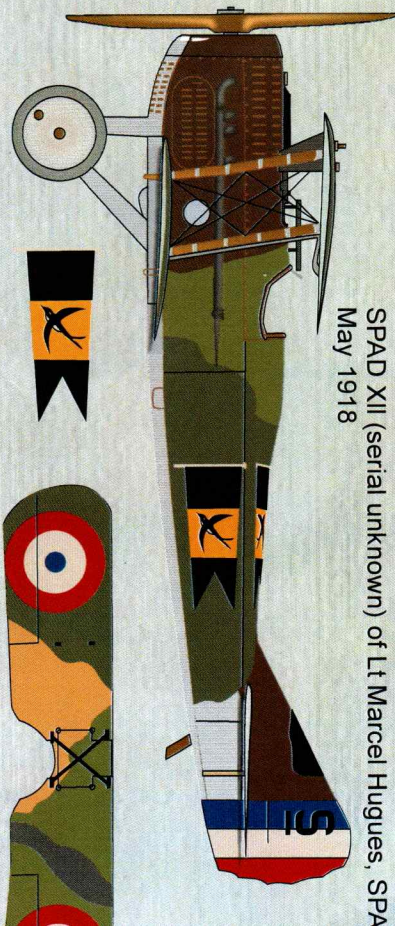


SPAD XIII S4830 of Lt Michel Joseph Callixte Marie Coiffard, SPA 154, October 1918

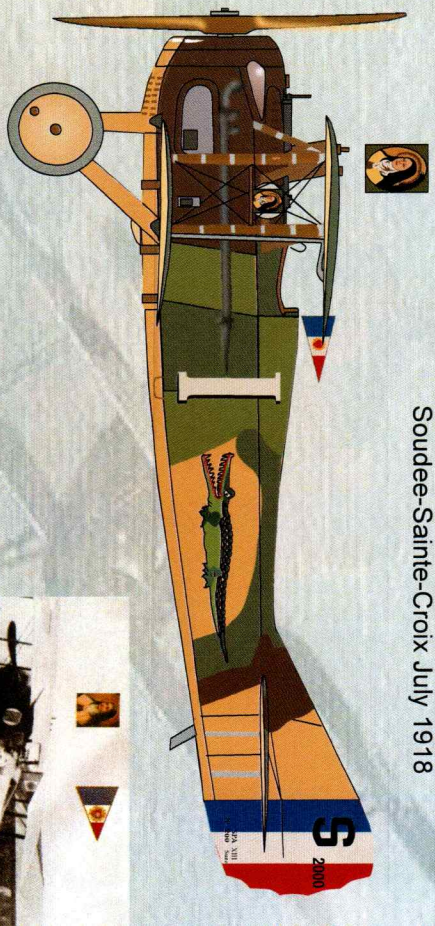

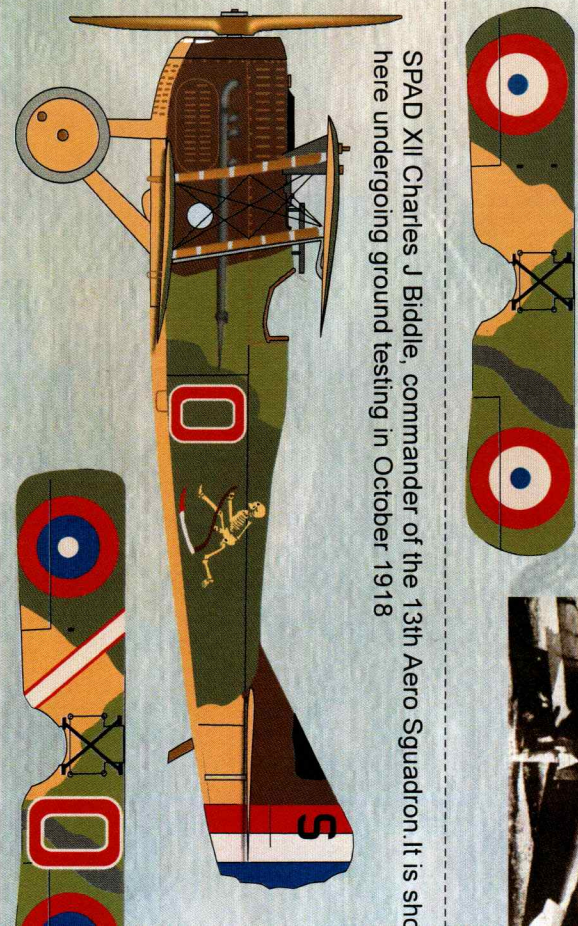

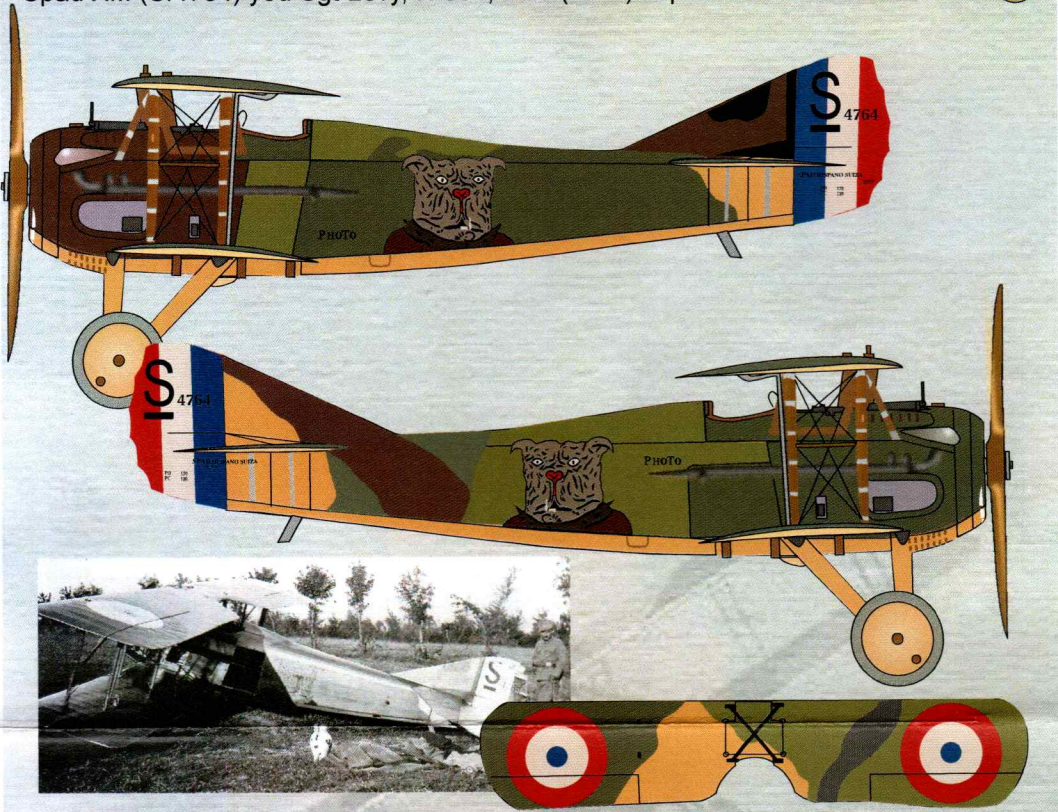


SPAD XII Charles J Biddle, commander of the 13th Aero Squadron. It is shown here undergoing ground testing in October 1918



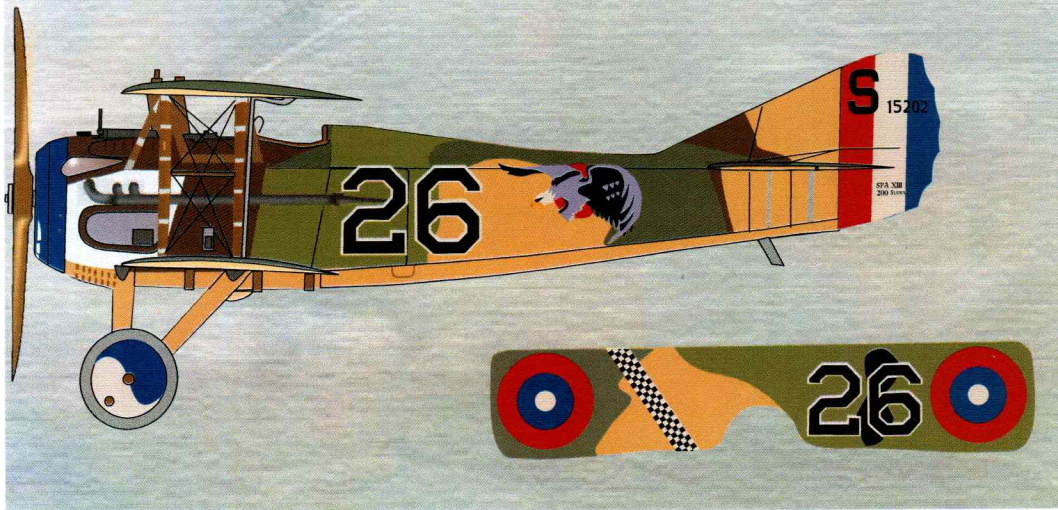

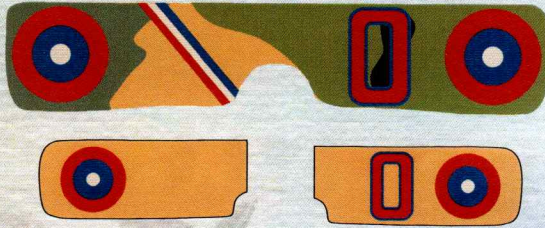
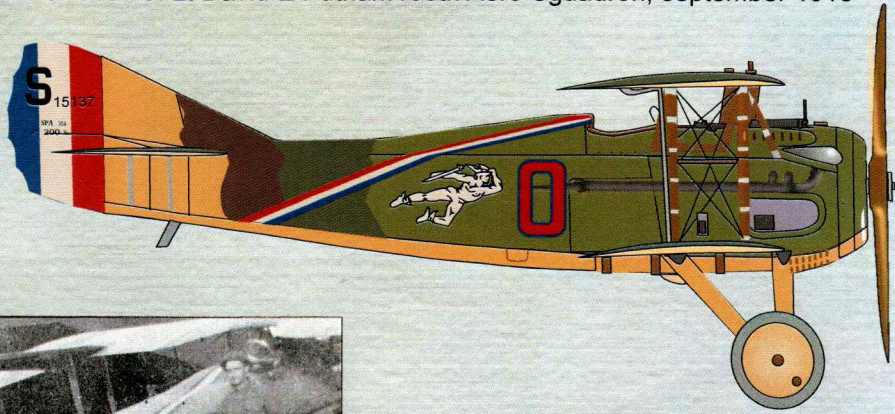
