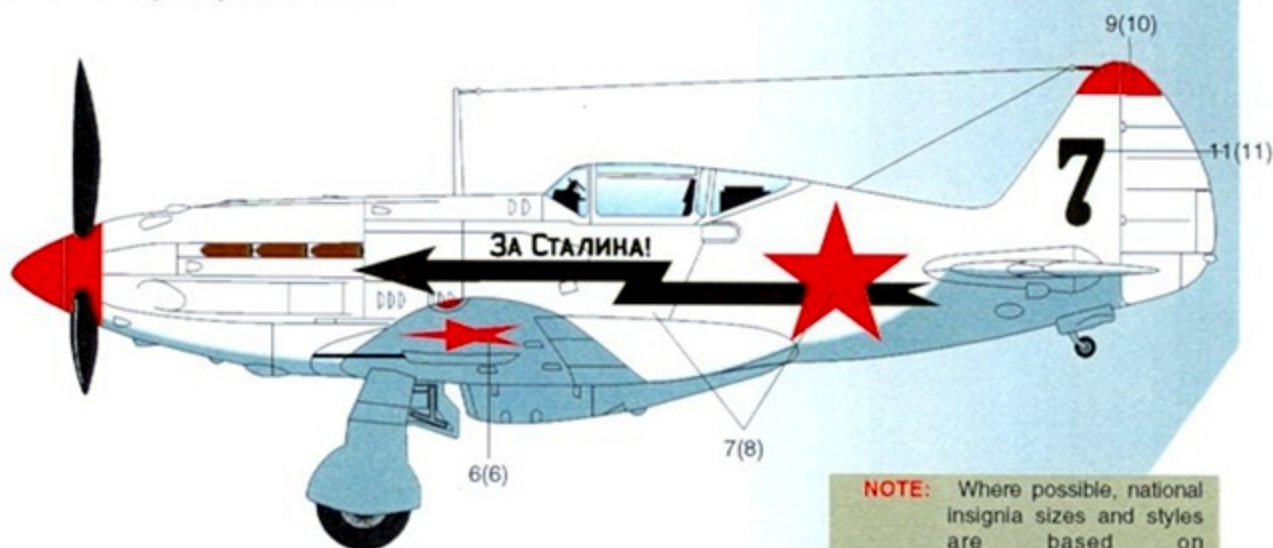

MiG-3's Early Warriors Pt II

1 Another colorful MiG-3 of the 6th Fighter Air Corps of the same period, this MiG-3 (right) sports White distemper over standard Soviet pale Blue-Gray — with a Red spinner and Red fin tip. Only the upper outer wing panels were Red (see inst. p.2). Note that wheel well interiors, as well as the landing gear themselves, were often painted in the under-surface color, as depicted here. Also note the underwing UB machine-gun gondola.



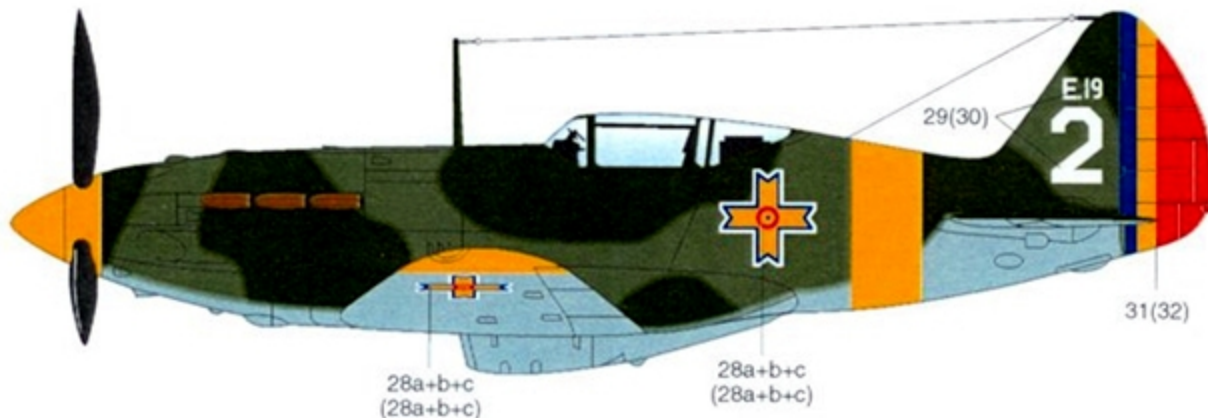
NOTE: Where possible, national insignia sizes and styles are based on photographic evidence!



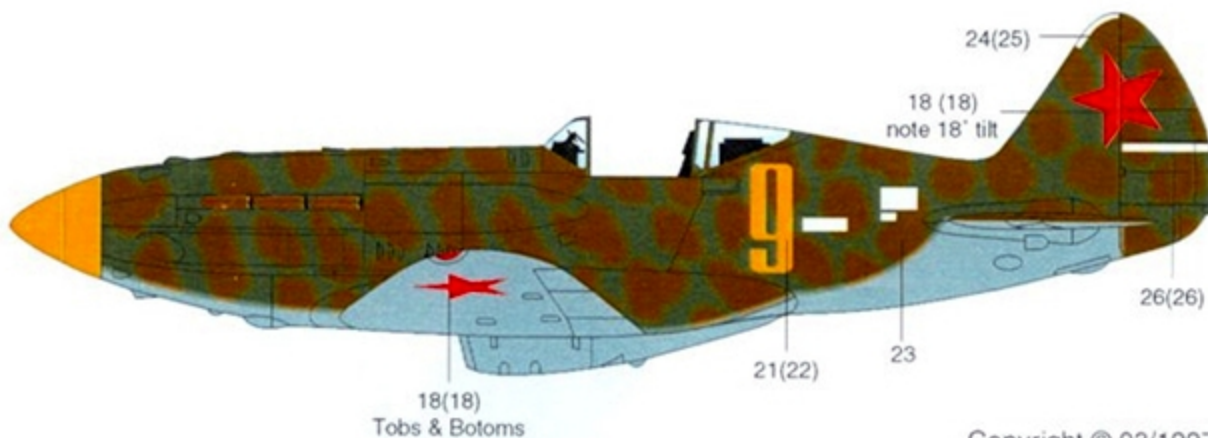
2 Still another MiG-3 of the 7th IAP during October 1941, this machine sports Earth Brown and Olive Green over Sky Blue. Note the absence of radio antenna masts. This aircraft might have carried four wing stars.

NOTE: Follow sheet numbering carefully! We have provided different versions of numbers and letters to reflect the typical Soviet practice of hand-painting codes.

3 Rumania employed this captured MiG-3 for dissimilar combat ("adversary") training. Note the apparent application of random Dark Green patches over the machine's original Dark Olive Green and Sky Blue Soviet scheme. Gloss finish, overall. Note, too, the Axis East-Front yellow I.D. trim on the spinner, fuselage band and ventral wing tips — as well as the odd rudder striping proportions.



4 An anonymous MiG-3 with mottled Earth Brown over Olive Green & Sky Blue, June 1941. Note the Yellow spinner. Extra "battle damage" patches (decals 27) are provided for the stbd. side?
