Camouflage: Overall white, with red spinner/cowling and red bands, anti-glare panel in deep navy blue.




**Fw-190G-3 W.Nr. 160057**, as above. Early 1945 with the new US Navy uniform.

Camouflage: upper surfaces - Non-Specular Sea Blue 697, sides Intermediate Blue 608 and white 601.



Fw-190 A-5, found in Tunisia by 79th FG. Painting scheme of Training School at Constantine, July 1943. Plane with anti dust filters.

Red/Yellow with Sand/Yellow band round the fuselage, later white decoration on cowling. Decals no: 7, 8, 9. Decals: 10, 11, 12 to different schemes - see Kecay Capture Butcherbirds vol.I






Fw-190 F-8, Yellow H, captured by South African soldiers in Italy (non-flyable condition). Painting scheme: standard F-8 scheme with red wingtips and yellow lower part of cowling.

German signs overpainted with British roundels/fin flash - rest of wing croses visible. Decals no: 13, 14, 15.
