March 1943

Lorne Cameron, DFC, would claim six confirmed and two probable victories. Aircraft fitted with short carb air intake, five spoke wheels and large upper wing cannon blisters.

Colors: Lower surfaces; Medium Sea Grey. Uppersurfaces; Dark Green and Ocean Grey.

Spinner and rear fuselage band; Sky type "S". Wing leading edges; Yellow

Sept 1943

George Keefer would receive the DSO and Bar, DFC and Bar, Netherlands Flying Cross and the French Croix de Guerre with Gold Star. He would complete three tours of operations and claim 17 enemy aircraft destroyed, 2 probables, and 9 damaged. Fitting his rank, this Spitfire displayed his initials on the fuselage. Aircraft fitted with extended carb air intake, narrow inboard cannon blisters and five spoke wheels.

Colors: Lower surfaces; Medium Sea Grey with non-standard D-day stripes on lower surface. The stripes were not applied to gear doors or extended to leading edge of wings. Uppersurfaces; Dark Green and Ocean Grey.

Spinner and rear fuselage band; Sky type "S". Wing leading edges; Yellow.

March 1943

Aircraft fitted with short carb air intake and large upper wing cannon blisters. Outer wing guns removed and ports faired over. Fuel cooler in the port wing root and gun camera in the starboard wing root. Later become the aircraft of W/C J.E. "Johnnie" Johnson. When he accepted the aircraft the s/n was reduced in size and repositioned on the sky band. Aircraft scrapped in 1948.

Colors: Lowersurfaces; Medium Sea Grey. Uppersurfaces; Dark Green and Ocean Grey.

Spinner and rear fuselage band; Sky type "S". Wing leading edges; Yellow

National Markings: Fuselage: 36" Type C.1

Wings: Upper - 56" Type B

Lower - 32" Type C
