Messerschmitt Bf 110 C/D Zerstorer

While designed for use with the Dragon 1/32nd scale Bf 110, they may also be adapted to the Revell Bf 110 kit.

For 1/48th scale Eduard or Fujimi, 1/72 Fujimi kits are suggested

Note the upper surface schemes provided here are representative of early factory patterns and may not reflect those actually applied. Upper surface patterns and colors are difficult to determine for this type, consult available references and photos in order to conclude proper patterns and colors.

Photograph depicts this aircraft as part of Operation *Donnerkeil* (Thunderbolt). This was the Channel dash of capital ships Scharnhorst, Gneisenau and Admiral Hipper in Feb 1942. Aircraft is fitted with enlarged span rudder trim tabs, which were retrofitted to some earlier aircraft. It is also fitted with an armored windscreen and White wall tail wheel tire. Note the Black number 5 applied to the left side as part of the fuselage codes is not aligned properly with the rest of the codes.

Colors: Undersurfaces: RLM 76. Uppersurfaces: RLM 74/75. Spinner tips and rear fuselage band near tail: White.

National Markings: Fuselage: 1000mm B2 Black and White cross

500mm H2a *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper: 1000mm B2 Black and White cross

Lower: 1200mm B2 Black and White cross

Photographs published in a number of books depict this aircraft as it undergoes major repairs at Benghazi in the summer of 1941.

Colors: Overall: Black except for replacement rear tailplane, which may have been RLM 65/71. Note only the portside lower rudder fincap is Black. The starboard side still matches the replacement rudder overall color.

Codes: Grey with aircraft letter "D" outlined in White on fuselage and lower wings. Upper wing code provisional.

Spinner tips and upper fuselage band: White. Port gear door: RLM 65.

National Markings: Fuselage: 1000mm B5 White cross

500mm H2a *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper: 1000mm B5 White cross

Lower: 1440mm B5 White cross

This aircraft equipped with the short span rudder trim tabs. Photographed without armored windscreen. Wing pylons not attached.

Colors: Undersurfaces: RLM 76 partially wrapping around uppersurfaces of leading edge of wings.

Uppersurfaces: RLM 74/75 with heavily mottled fuselage sides. Engine cowlings, gun cowl and rudders: Yellow.

Spinners: RLM 70 with Yellow tips. Spinner backplate: RLM 70 and White segment, possibly replacement.

Codes: Black with individual aircraft letter "S" in Yellow.

National Markings: Fuselage: 1000mm B2 Black and White cross

500mm H2a *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper: 1000mm B3 Black and White cross

Lower: 1200mm B3 Black and White cross
