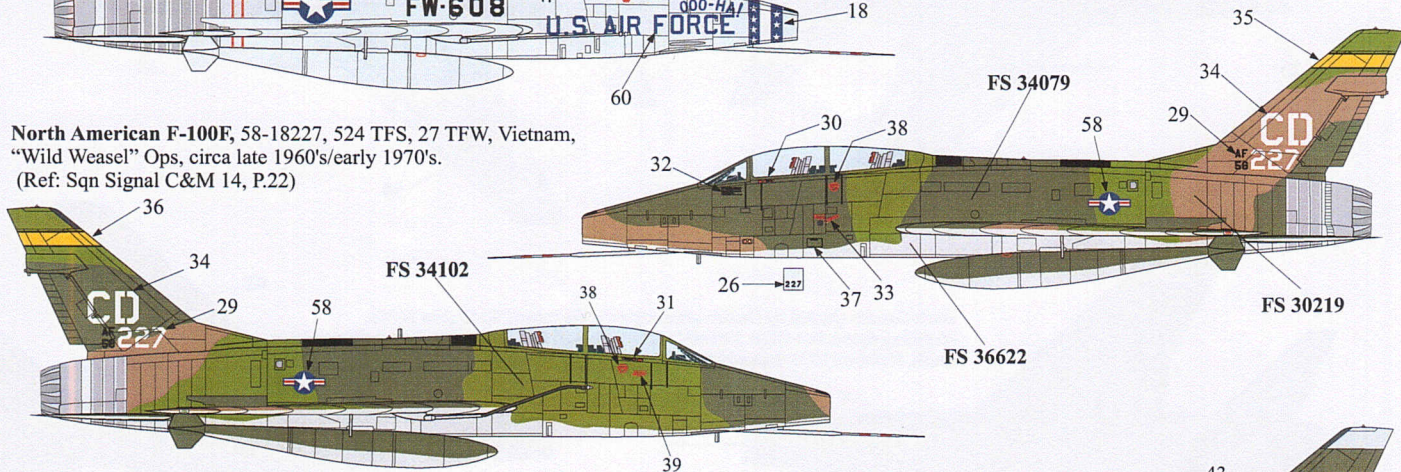

In August 1959, the first single engine jet to fly over the North Pole.



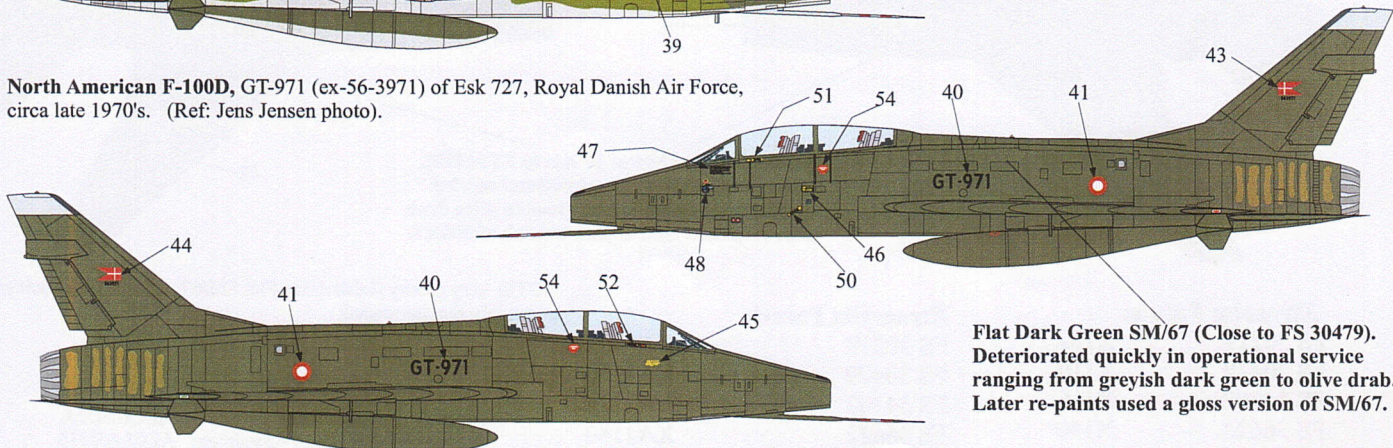
North American F-100D, 55-3608, 416 TFS, 21 TFW, Misawa, Japan, 1959. (Ref: DTU P.57).



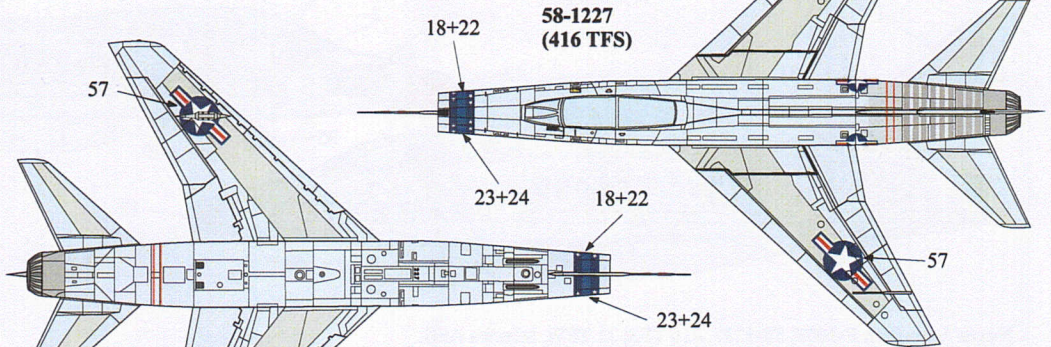
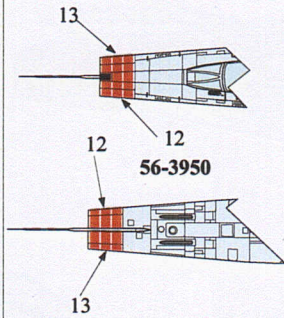

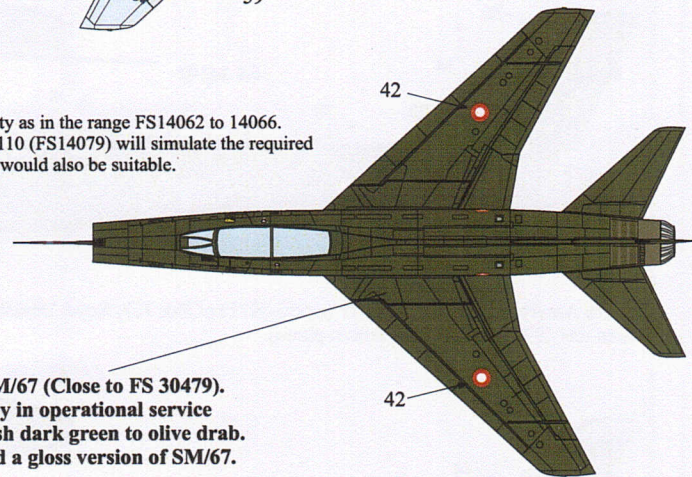
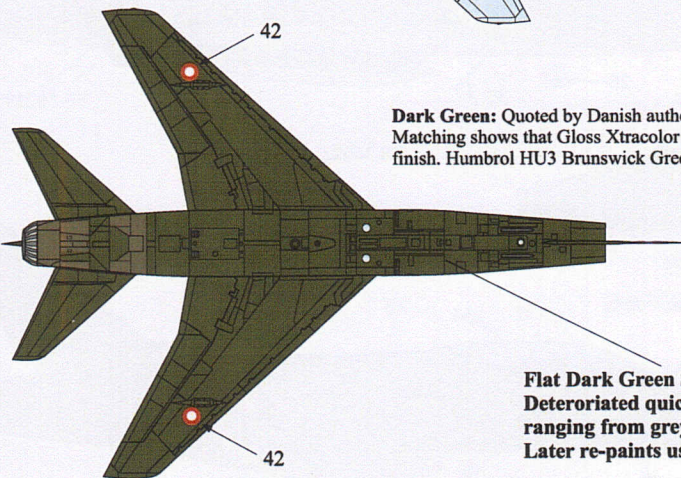
Flat Dark Green SM/67 (Close to FS 30479). Deteriorated quickly in operational service ranging from greyish dark green to olive drab. Later re-paints used a gloss version of SM/67.



“Natural Metal” F-100s were painted Aluminium overall - except for the burnt metal areas at the rear. However, photographs show that on some aircraft different panels on the wings appear in darker shades - possibly anti-slip paint.



Dark Green: Quoted by Danish authority as in the range FS14062 to 14066. Matching shows that Gloss Xtracolor X110 (FS14079) will simulate the required finish. Humbrol HU3 Brunswick Green would also be suitable.



Flat Dark Green SM/67 (Close to FS 30479). Deteriorated quickly in operational service ranging from greyish dark green to olive drab. Later re-paints used a gloss version of SM/67.

NOTE: Very patchy finish using Flat SM/67, reference to photographs is strongly recommended.
