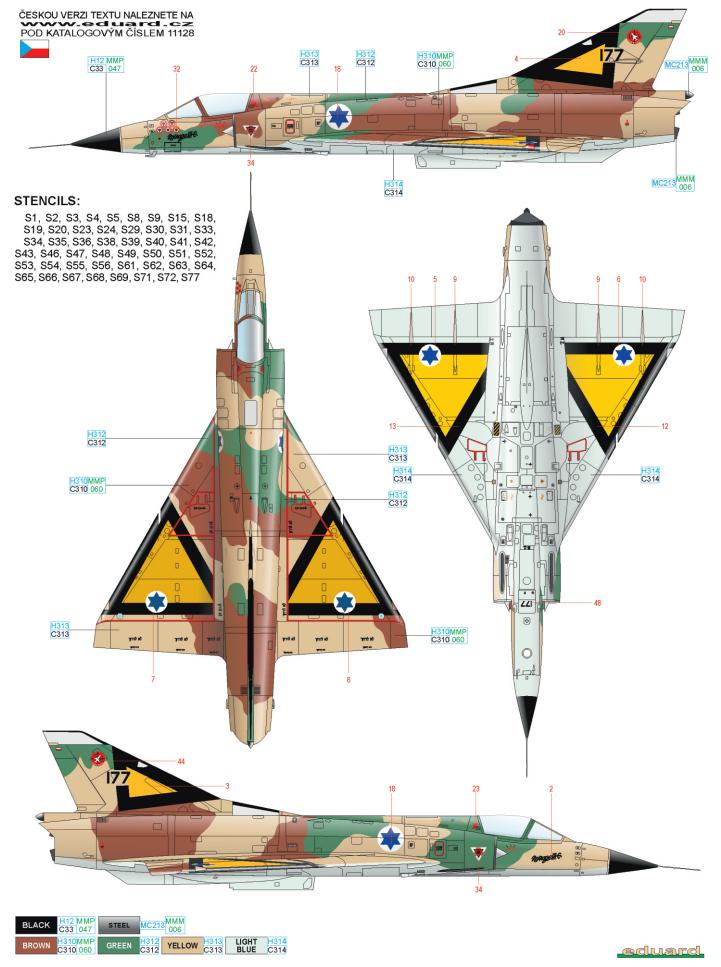






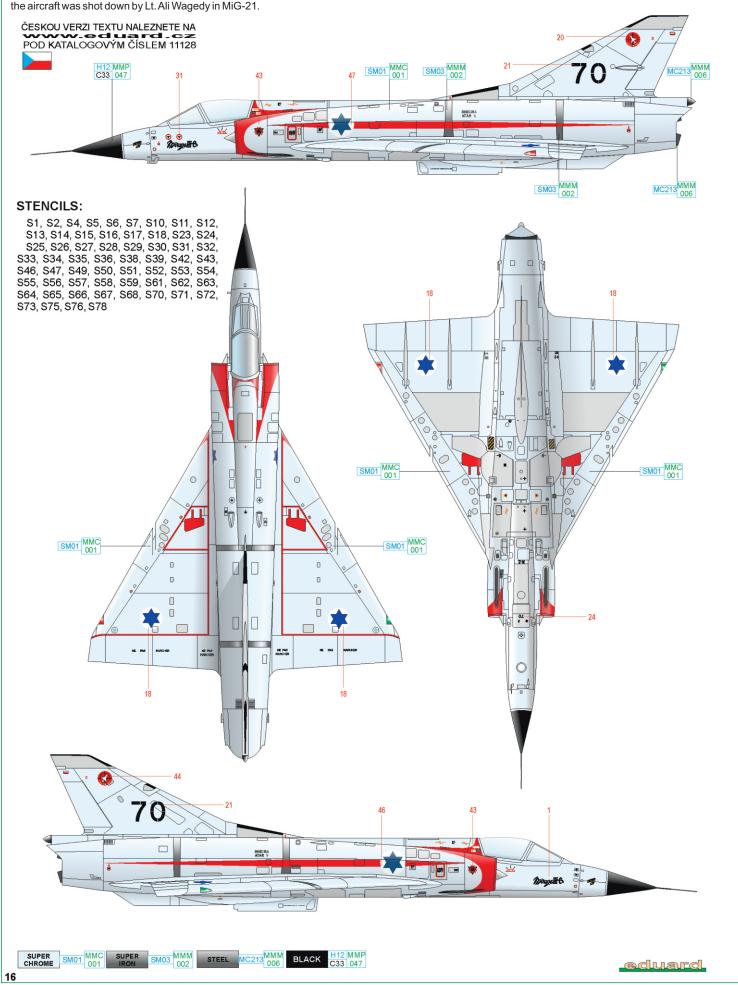
#### A No. 177, 117 Tayeset, Ramat David Air Base, Israel, 1977

Camouflaged Shachak nr. 177 from 117 Tayeset based at Ramat David as it appeared in 1977. Gaudy black-yellow triangles were introduced during the Yom Kippur War. Of interest are five kill markings of the Syrian aircraft painted under the canopy (three stars in the white ring). Actually, the Israeli pilots at the controls of this airplane shot down 5 Egyptian aircraft and one Syrian aircraft. Egyptian aircraft kill was marked with two stars in the white ring. Reason for swapping the symbols remains unknown.



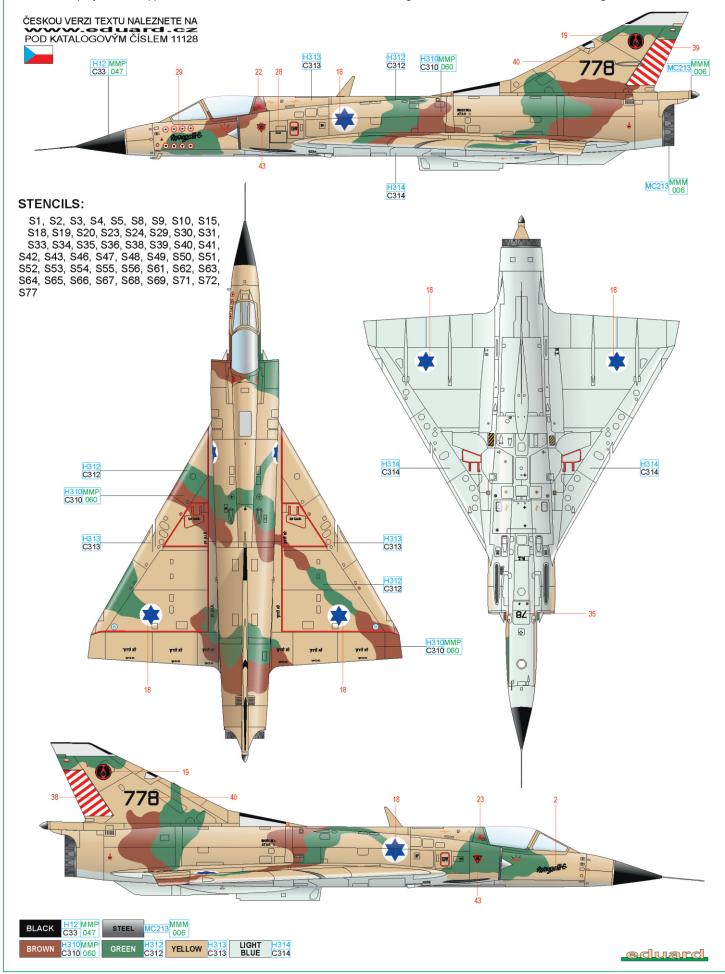
#### B No. 70, 117 Tayeset, Ramat David Air Base, Israel, June 1967

Shachak nr. 70 from 117 Tayeset from Ramat David airbase as it flew right after the Six Days War. At its controls the Israeli pilots claimed four aerial kills in total. Two Syrian MiG-21s during the Six Days War followed by the couple of Egyptian MiG-21s during the War of Attrition. The aircraft was shot down on March 2nd, 1970, and its pilot Ithamar Neuner ejected. Israeli sources state the ground fire as the cause of the aircraft loss, according to Egyptian sources the aircraft was shot down by I.f. Ali Wagedy in MiG-21



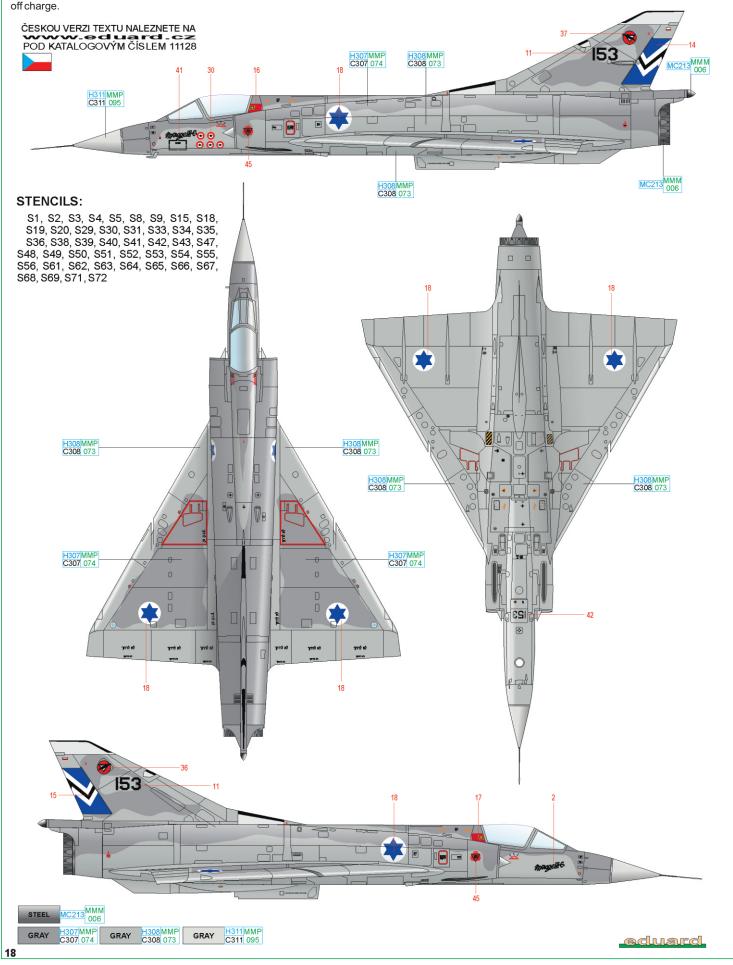
#### C No. 778, 101 Tayeset, Hatzor Air Base, Israel, 1972

Shachak nr. 778 in the colors of 101 Tayeset as it appeared at the end of 1972 when it was already credited with 8.5 kills instead of 8 painted under the canopy. It's the first airframe converted to the Atar 9C engine. The total kill score of this aircraft is 10.5 (it's also the highest scoring aircraft in the Six Days War). It was lost on October 10th, 1973 during the Yom Kippur War during the combat with the Syrian MiG-17s, its pilot Eitan Carmi ejected. The camouflaged aircraft were sprayed on the upper surfaces with sand FS 33531, brown FS 30219 and green FS 34227, the lower surfaces were light blue FS 35622.



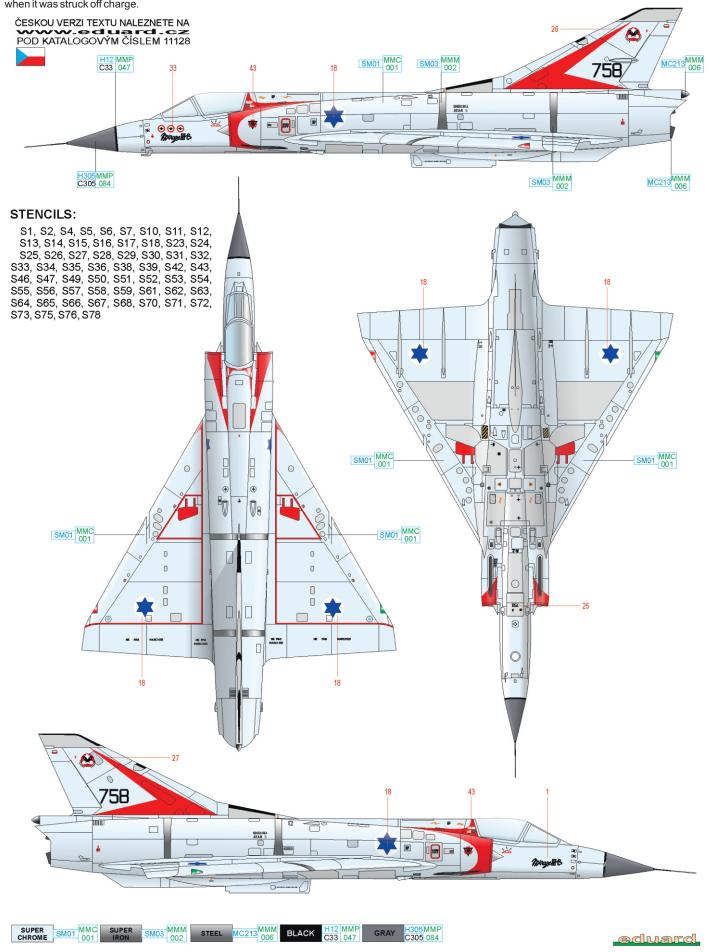
#### D No. 153, 253 Tayeset, Eitam Air Base, Israel, 1980

One of three Shachaks which at the end of their service in Israel were painted in so-called Air-superiority coating consisting of grey colors FS 36375 and FS 36320, was the airframe nr. 153 with the Atar 9C engine (the other two were numbers 103 and 144). The aircraft originally served with 119 Tayeset where it was rebuilt to the photo-reconnaissance version in 1963 and Ran Ronen crashed it in the same year. It was returned to service after five years long repair as the original fighter version. It was included into 117 Tayeset inventory and unit's pilots achieved three kills at its controls. In 1979 it was handed over to 253 Tayeset and then 254 Tayeset where it served until 1982. Then it was sold to Argentina where it flew as C-710 until September 1985 when it was struck off charge.



#### E No. 758, 119 Tayeset, Tel Nof Air Base, Israel, 1969

Shachak sporting thirteen kill markings to its credit is the aircraft nr. 58 (also known as 758, 458 or 158). It's shown here in its original natural metal finish from 1969 carrying the colors of 119 Tayeset from Tel Nof airbase. Of interest is the number of kill markings painted under the canopy. According to the available documents either two or four markings should have been painted on. These kills were as follows: June 8th, 1967, pilot Reuven Rozen (Egyptian MiG-21), May 21st, 1969, pilot Reuven Rozen (Egyptian MiG-21) and July 2nd, 1969, pilot Eitan Carmi (two Egyptian MiG-21s). In the following years the aircraft served with 101, 253 and 254 Tayeset and Israeli pilots achieved another 9 kills with it. In 1982 it was sold to Argentina where, carrying C-174 markings, served until 1990 when it was struck off charge.
