


38592 ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

One of the rare body styles for the Model A was the station wagon, less than 10% of the five million A's made were of this type. Featuring a hard rock maple body and side curtains instead of steel and glass, the '29 "Woodie" is a rare collectors item indeed. The interior was strictly functional, the car was intended to carry passengers and luggage from the train station to

their destination, usually someone's country home or town house. The Murray-built body featured a large tailgate, useful for loading large trunks and suitcases. Nicely proportioned, the Model A "Woodie" makes a sharp street and surf rod surf rod as well as a collector showpiece

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IMPORTANT

Before you begin assembling your model kit, study the instruc-tion sheet carefully. This will help you to familiarize yourself with the location of parts Follow the instructions carefully and "TEST FIT" parts before cementing them into place. It may be necessary to remove excess "FLASH" from some parts in order to achieve proper fit, a sharp hobby knife or a file work best.

If you wish to paint your model, various sub-assemblies and components should be painted before any plated or "CHROME" parts are attached.


These kits are molded from the finest high-impact styrene plastic. Use only paints and cements which are specifically for mulated for styrene. It is important to read all labels and warn-

For the best possible finish you should paint your model, even if it is molded in color. Several thin coats of paint will look: a lot better than one heavy coat. be polished to a high luster after the paint has dried all the way through, at least for three days. Use an automotive paste cleaner/wax, not a polishing compound. Model paint is "softer" than regular automotive touch-up paint, even when the polishing the fine the polishing the paint paint, even when the gloss of the finish. If you do this, be sure to wash the wax off, using a dish detergent/water solution and rinse as described above. You should also rinse the parts with luckwarm water bet ween sanding and painting to remove residue, use a tack rag to You rany which to prepare your parts before painting. 

ings carefully, and put the lids back on between each use. These products should only be used in well ventilated areas.

Because these cements will only adhere to bare plastic it is necessary to remove the paint and the plating from those areas to which cement is to be applied. Use cement sparingly and avoid getting cement onto exposed surfaces.

TIPS

lightly sand or scrape all corners and edges of parts as paint tends to draw away from sharp edges. Filler putty designed for plestic may also be used to fill small gaps and blend contours between assembled parts. A little care makes a big difference in

between assembled parts. A finde care makes a big difference in finished appearance. For painting two-tone bodies, paint the lightest color first and fer if dry fir at least 24 hours. Using frosted or "mage" tapeied in dry first a first part of the particle particle and the coord color and remove the masking as soon as the new paint siddy to the touch. Curefully touch up be paint edges with a mad brash if necessary. A gloss cout, may be applied to even out the two paint surfaces after the second color is dry.






Use a good sharp model knife to trim and detach plastic parts. Some parts will appear to have extra "tabs" on them - cut these off.
