


BLACK JACK / THE JOKER'S WILD B-17F-20-BO 41-24521


Flying with the 63rd Bomb Squadron 43rd Bomb Group this B-17F had a colorful history. One of her pilots, Capt. Kenneth D. McCullar had a fixed 50 cal. fitted to the nose controlled by the pilot for machine gunning ships and deterring frontal attacks. BLACK JACK claims a number of Japanese ships including the IJN destroyer HAYASHIO which was sunk on the 24th of November 1942. This feat required 5 low altitude bombing runs and caused








heavy damage to BLACK JACK. Repaired, she was once again shot up on a mission to Rabaul on the 14th of February 1943. Her last mission was on the 10th of July 1943, a night attack on Rabaul through a severe thunderstorm left her with no compass or radio homing device and three injured crew. Running on 2 1/2 engines they made it through the night but were low on fuel. BLACK JACK was ditched successfully 11th of July off the coast of New Guinea and the crew were rescued. BLACK JACK was discovered by scuba divers 27th of December 1986. Noseart was painted by Sgt. Ernie Vandal who also painted PANAMA HATTIE also featured in this set.
































These chips represent fresh paint. Some of these B-17's would have faded to at least fs34201. Control surfaces were dope and usually faded on top quicker than the paint and became much lighter. Factor in scale effect when mixing paint as well, some of these B-17's such as KNOCKOUT DROPPER were very faded and weathered.

NOTES

The Revell 1/48 B-17F as well as Academy and Hasegawa 1/72 B-17F all show 10 fuel fillers on the top of the wings, All of these B-17's featured on this sheet had no Tokyo Tanks and therefore should have the outermost 2 on each wing removed for a total of 6 tank fillers. The data in each tank filler decal is specific to that tank so check the instructions to be sure they are located correctly. Revell's 1/48 B-17F originally had the pitot tubes located correctly but recent released had them lowered by 2 panels, this will affect placement of some of the nose art, so consult photo's and references for correct placement. Also the Revell 1/48 B-17F ADF 'football' is located too far to the left, it should be on the other side of the panel line closer to the centerline, this will affect how the nose art for Snoozin' Suzan fits the model. Academy's B-17F is available as a late F with the 'Fort Alamo II' version which has only late cheek bulged windows which are incorrect for all versions in our set. The Academy B-17F 'Memphis Belle' version has the flush cheek windows but still needs the astrodome removed for earlier versions, but works well for WAR BRIDE, TWO BEAUTS, THE SHAMROCK SPECIAL and FORT ALAMO II Hasegawa's B-17F is good for all but the above mentioned, as it has no astrodome. All of the nose art was carefully drawn after the original, so if the bombs are a bit out of line, that's because they were on the original.

HON! KUU OKOLE is an E with enlarged cheek windows, some conversion is necessary for the Revell 1/48 kit. It is standard olive drab over neutral gray.

SUPERMAN is an early F with no astrodome and carries 'Operation Torch' yellow insignia outlines and is standard olive drab over neutral gray.

PANAMA HATTIE is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray with the outer starboard wing panel and aileron showing medium green blotching, possibly being replaced from another B-17. The name came from the MGM musical featuring Ann Sothern who had blond hair and with no color photo's, this is what we have given her.

THE RED GREMLIN is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray and 'Operation Torch' insignia.

SNOOZIN' SUZAN is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray and 'Operation Torch' insignia.

MEMPHIS BELLE is an early F with no astrodome and features medium green blotching over standard olive drab and neutral gray. Crew names have been provided but were added after her last mission so are optional. The 'BELLE' sported fancy wheel covers, and it is most probable that one side was blue and the other red, as both have been seen on her in color photo's and film. On her last mission as she taxies up, the port wheel disk is blue and in the previous flyby the starboard is red, this is the most likely intended placement, as it coincides with the bathing suits on the pinups.

BLACK JACK/THE JOKER'S WILD is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray.

THE MUSTANG is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray. The nose art on the starboard nose was painted right over the aft window and later the horses head was painted over as well, we have left the horses head which you may paint over if desired.

HELL'S ANGELS is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray with medium green blotching. At the time of it's return stateside the codes had changed from yellow to gray for the fuselage. The only photo available of the port nose, shows only the name which may explain why most of the photo's show the starboard nose, hence the difference. She also clearly shows the older red surround insignia under her wing, it was common to see the wing insignia left in red surround although you have a choice if you wish otherwise.

KNOCKOUT DROPPER is an early F with no astrodome and standard olive drab over neutral gray with medium green blotching. Her olive paint was very faded and more closely resembles fs34201 sac bomber tan with the green blotching remaining darker. Later in her career she was fitted with the single 50 cal. mount on the nose glazing.

WAR BRIDE/OLD FAITHFUL is a mid production F with astrodome and single 50 cal. nose mount with standard olive drab over neutral gray camouflage.

TWO BEAUTS is a mid production F with astrodome and single 50 cal. nose mount with standard olive drab over neutral gray carnouflage. She didn't last long and would have shown very little weathering.

THE SHAMROCK SPECIAL is a mid production F with astrodome and single 50 cal. nose mount with standard olive drab over neutral gray camouflage. She suffered extensive damage from another B-17 in a landing mishap and had the entire rear fuselage changed, the donor B17 being older with larger fuselage insignia and faded as well.

FORT ALAMO II is a mid production F with astrodome and single 50 cal. nose mount with standard olive drab over neutral gray camouflage. Rudder and elevators insignia red with group markings on fin as well as elevator and horizontal stabilizer.
