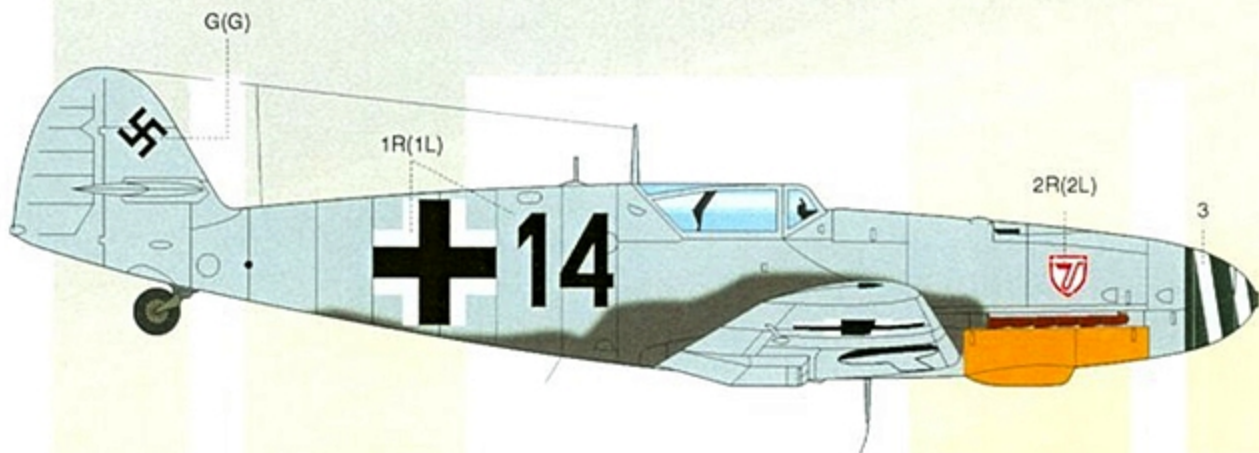

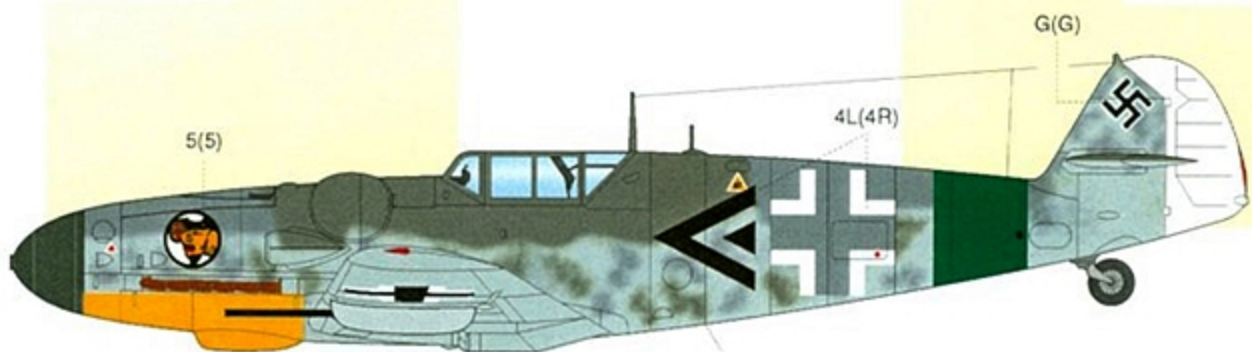

Fwbl. Horst Petzschler of 2./JG3 flew this Bf109G-6/AS in combat during May, 1944, against American B-17's, B-24's and P-51's. His mount sports faded RLM76 Lichtgrau overall. Note the RLM04 Gelb cowl chin and White spiraled RLM70 prop spinner. Sides and bottom were very dirty with exhaust stains.

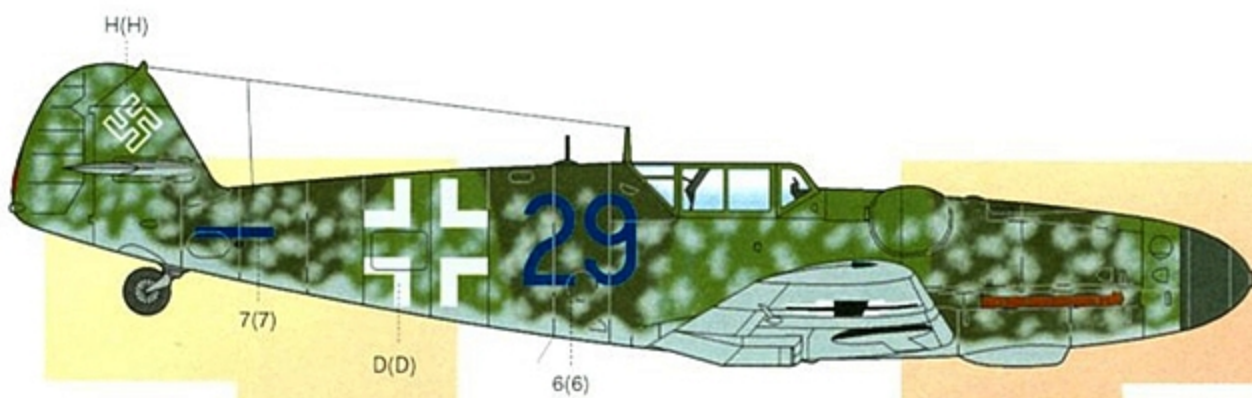
**For a quick conversion, use the Monogram/Revell G-10 or Hobbycraft Me109K fuselage with the Hobbycraft G 6 wing. Shave off the lower cowling bumps, and cut off the rudder trim tabs.



Hptm. Ludwig Franzisket of 1./JG27 flew this Bf109G-6 against the Allied bomber offensive over Austria in May, 1944. His machine wears RLM74 Dunkelgrau, RLM 75 Grauviolet with RLM74/75 side mottling over RLM76 Lichtgrau. Note the RLM04 Gelb cowl chin, RLM25 Grün Reich defense band, and RLM70 Schwarzgrün spinner. Franzisket achieved a total of 43 kills.



A/C 3: Bf109 G6 of an unidentified unit, Spring of 1945, possibly a training unit. Very rare camouflage of RLM82/83/76 with RLM 76 splotches over Greens. No cowling or wing tip markings. Spinner RLM 70. Short antennae mast. Upper surfaces camouflage is conjectural. Notice unusual position of lower wing crosses. A truly rare bird!



A/3 4: Bf 109F-4 of JG5., Flown by OBFW Bartels (final score 99) off Petsamo, Finland. Camouflaged in RLM 70/74/75/76. Yellow cowling (theatre markings) but Yellow lower wing tip color is unconfirmed. Spinner halved (or 1/3) in RLM 70 & White. Wrk number is unknown. Upperwing pattern unknown but possibly as depicted? Any information is welcome!
