

The first production FM-2 left the Easter Aircraft production in the middle of 1943.

The FM-2 had a more powerfull Wright R-1820 radial engine. Aditionaly, the plane could carry four rather than six .50 caliber machina guns and was often fitted with HVARs. The FM-2 also had a larger tail than standard F4F to counter the increased torque produced by the Wright engine.

The General Motors FM-2 was the most numerous Wildcat variant produced. From mid-1943 to the end of the war, General Motors bulit 4,127 FM-2s nearly 70% of all Wildcats produced.

Of those, 340 planes went to the RAF as Martlet VI. The U.S. Navy FM-2s operate exclusively from eskort carriers (CVEs).




