B-24D-5-CO 41-23795 'Sneezy' 343BS 98BG Libyan desert 1942 - 1943




Equipped with radar and was used in a sea search role early in its career, and may have been operated by other than the 343rd BS.


Converted back to a bomber and served in that role with the 343rd from 3 March, 1943 through approximately 30 May 1943 during which time it's name was changed to Sneezy in compliance with the Snow White Squadron directive.

1 Aug 43 'Sneezy' had been transferred to the 344th BS and was flown on the low level Ploesti mission by the Donald Johnson crew. It's operational career ended 23 Feb 44.

B-24D 41-11776 'Bashful/Jersey Jackass' 343BS 98BG Libyan desert 1942 - 1943 Lost near the target, Ploesti.


