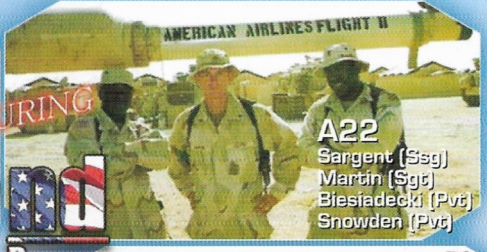

CIP Chevrons:

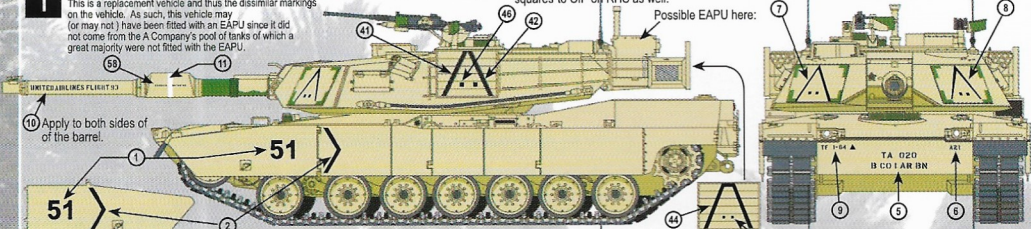
A, B and C Style Chevrons on the decal sheet are given extra lengths so that they can be trimmed to fit any kit or aftermarket CIPs out there. The best method of application is to apply the decals first, then carefully cut off the excess with a sharp blade when dry, before finally sealing with a clear mattiflat coat.



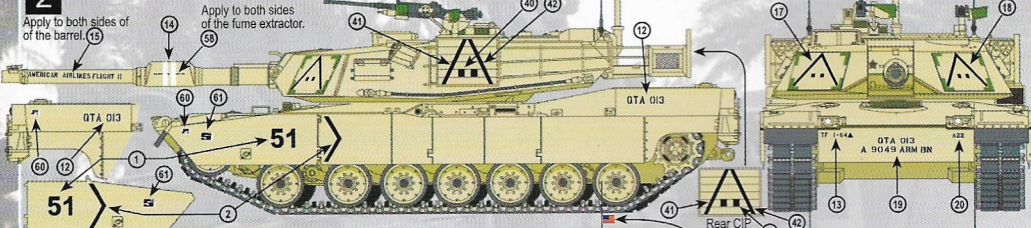
Battleboard dimensions - approximately 21mm (H) x 21mm (W) in 1/35 or 10.2mm (H) x 10.2mm (W) in 1/72

1 1st gun tank "UNITED AIRLINES FLIGHT 93", 2nd Platoon, A Company.

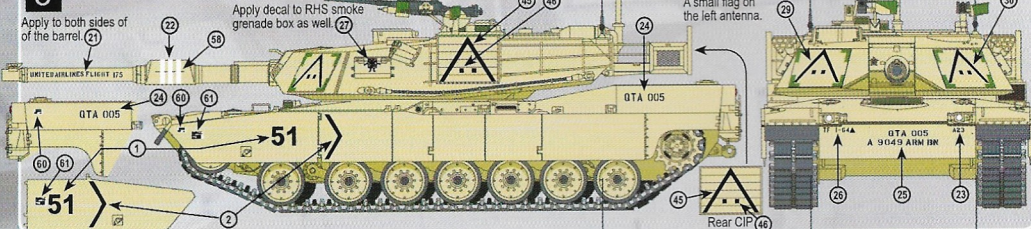

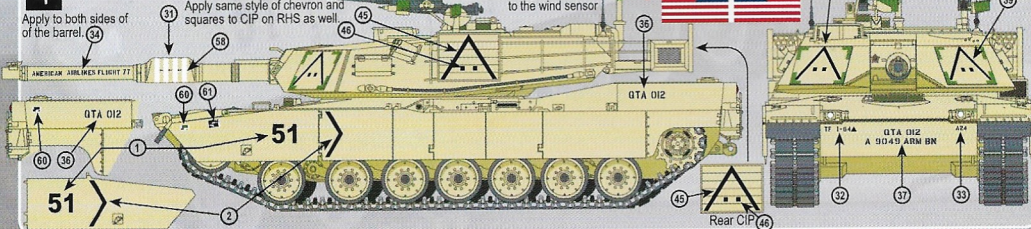
2 2nd gun tank "AMERICAN AIRLINES FLIGHT 11", 2nd Platoon, A Company.

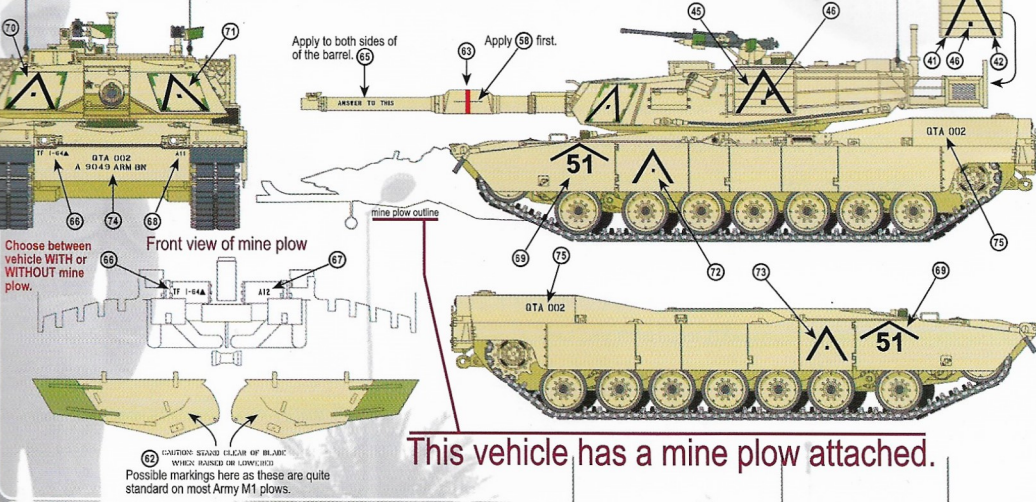

 A12 was fitted with a plow. Therefore, the badly damaged vehicle's plow went to A11.

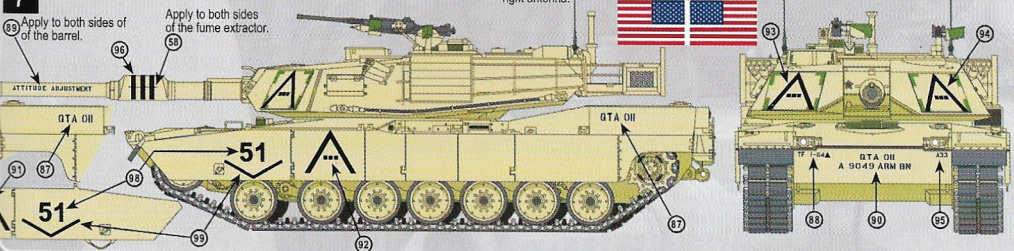


This vehicle has a mine plow attached.

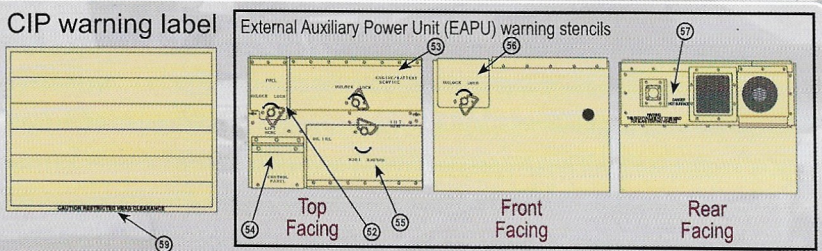
6 2nd gun tank "ALL BOUT DA BONES", 3rd Platoon, A Company.

HANDLE WITH CARE:
 The clear film of each decal has been cropped as much as possible to the edge of each artwork so as to avoid trapped air bubbles during application. At times, artwork are linked together with clear film 'connectors' for the more experienced modellers. For ease of application, it may be necessary to cut the 'connectors' or even some of the decals up so that tearing can be best avoided.

The second platoon received a replacement tank when the original A21 was deemed unoperational. It's quite likely (but unconfirmed) that this replacement vehicle had the EAPU fitted since it wasn't part of the 1-64 tanks originally. Note that most of 1-64 tanks did not have EAPUs fitted, according to SFC Eric Olson and Robert Burik.
