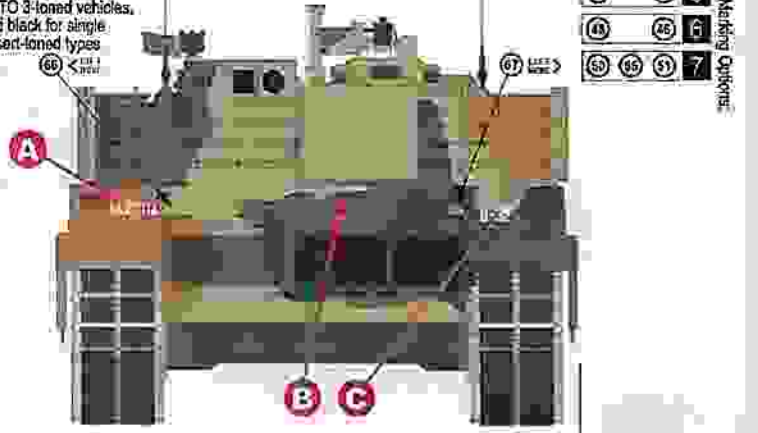

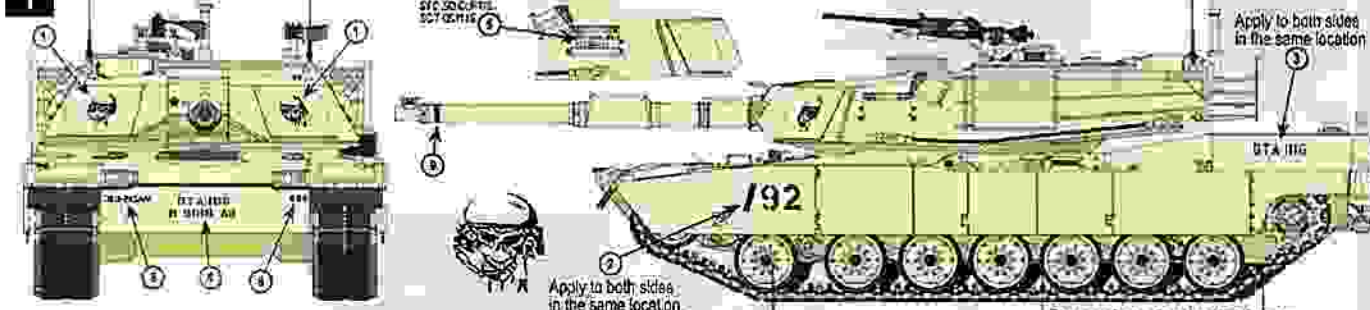

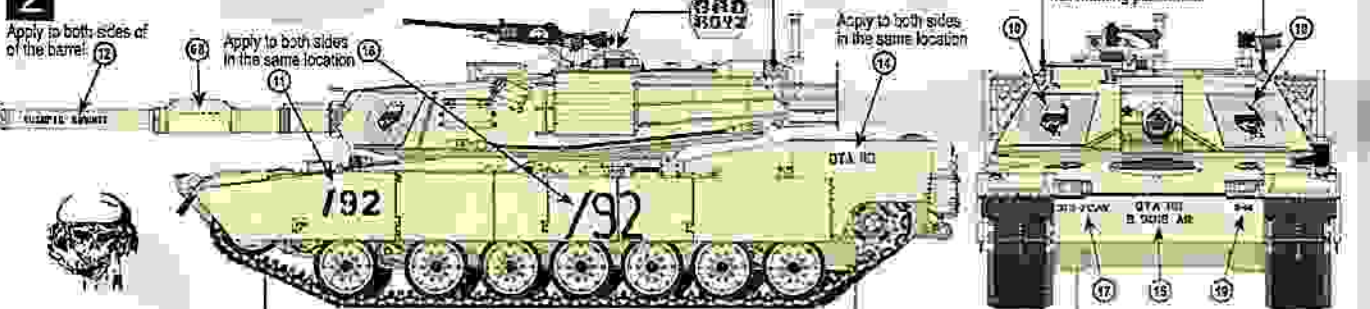

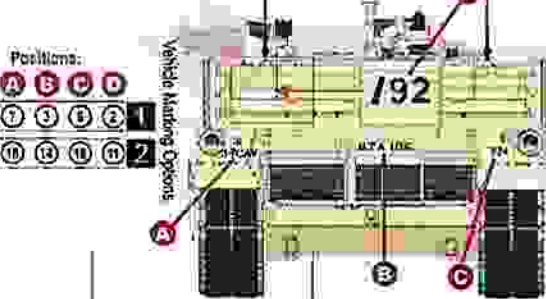
1 4th gun tank, 2nd Platoon, B Company, 3-7 Cavalry.



2 4th gun tank "BUSHPIG BANDITS", 4th Platoon, B Company, 3-7 Cavalry.



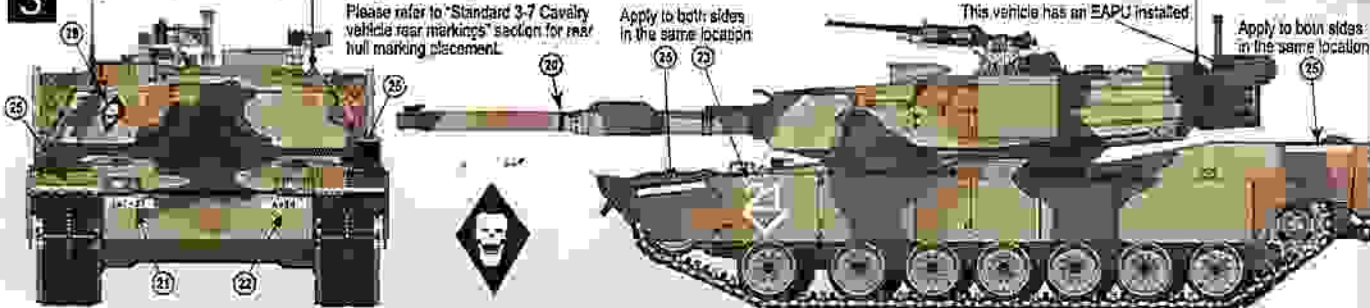
Standard 3-7 Cavalry vehicle rear markings.



Standard 1-37 Armor vehicle rear markings.

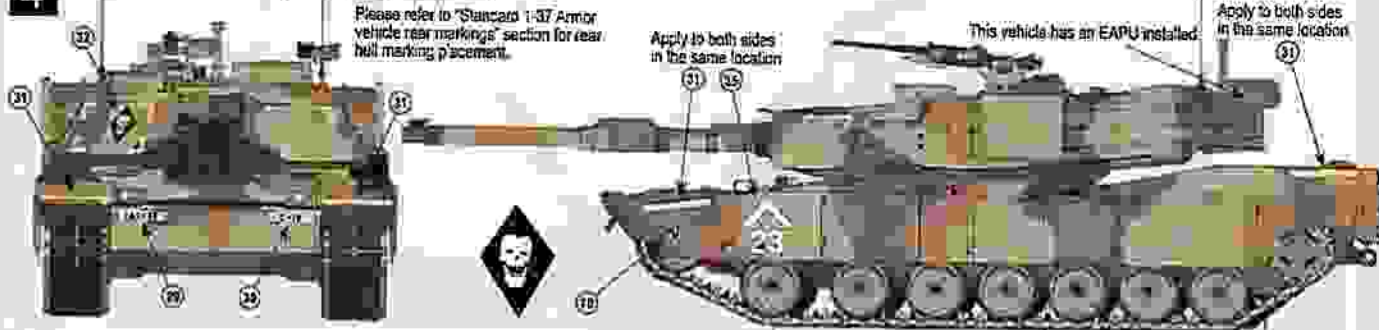


3 4th gun tank, 3rd Platoon, A Company, 1-37 Armor.

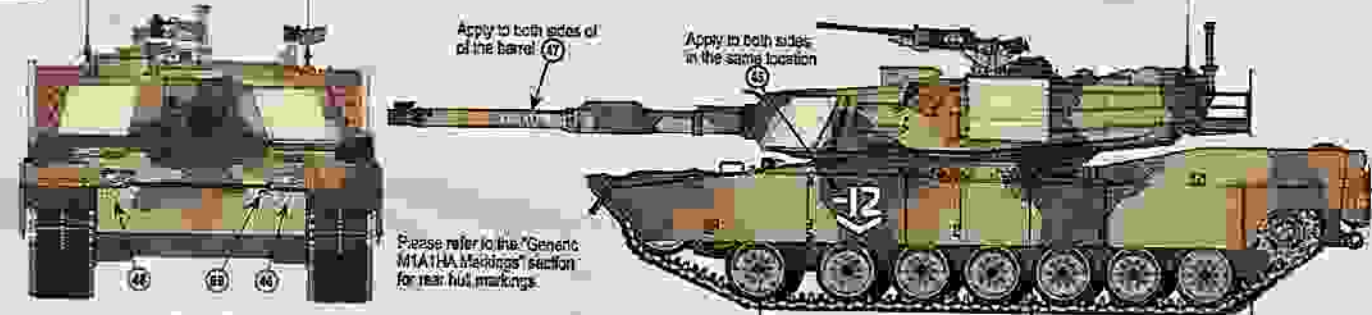


5 2nd gun tank "BANG BUS", 3rd Platoon, B Company, 2-70 Armor.

101st Airborne's 187th & 502nd special patches on the smoke canister box

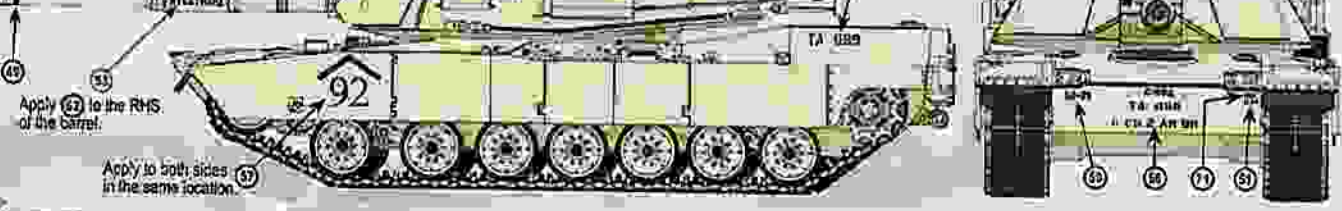


6 4th gun tank "BIG HITCH", 3rd Platoon, B Company, 2-70 Armor.

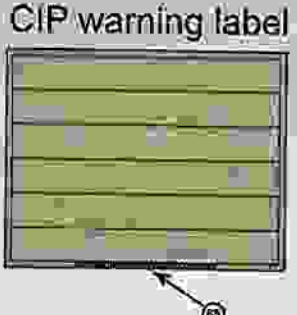


7 4th gun tank "BAGHDAD'S NIGHTMARE", 1st Platoon, B Company, 2-89 Armor.

HANDLE WITH CARE:
The clear film of each decal has been cropped as much as possible to the edge of each artwork so as to avoid trapped air bubbles during application. At times, artwork are linked together with clear film "connectors" for the more experienced modelers. For ease of application, it may be necessary to cut the "connectors" or even some of the decals up so that tearing can be best avoided.
