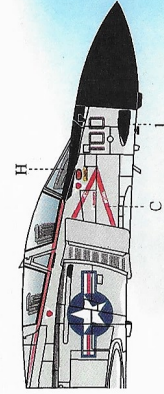
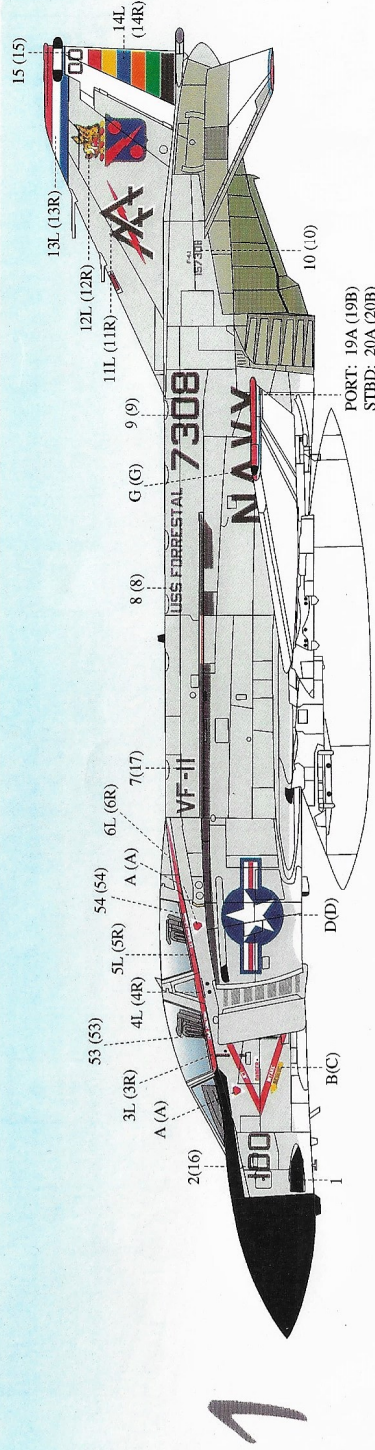
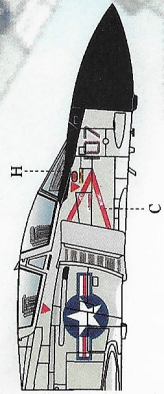
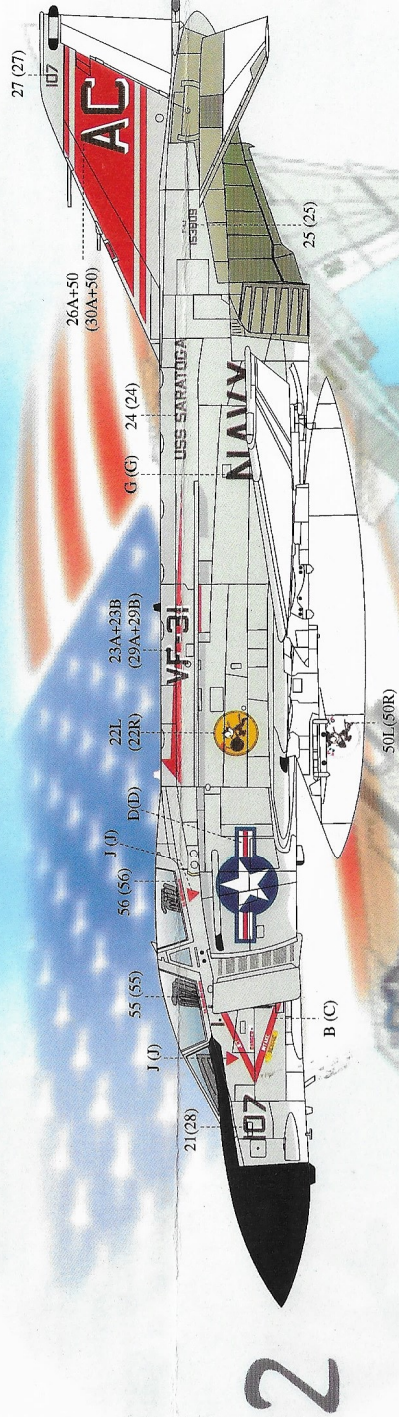


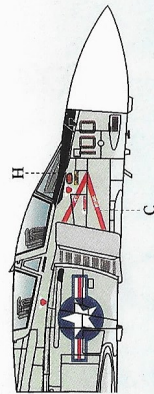
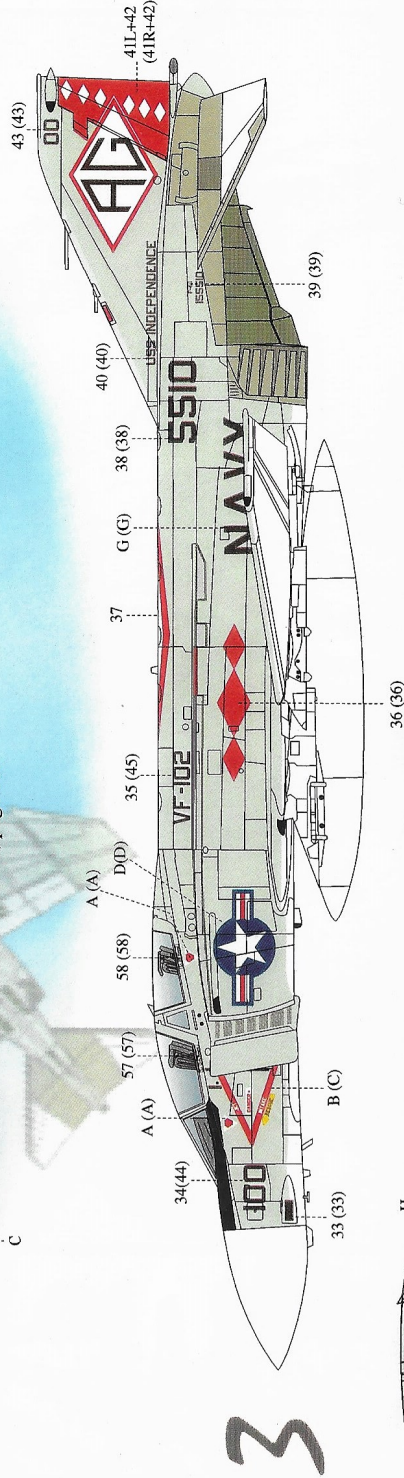
Phoney Phantoms



F-4J Phantom BuNo. 157308. Air Wing 17 CAG bird of VF-11 *Red Rippers* aboard USS *Forrestal* (CV-59) in 1976. Matt Gull Gray FS36440 on upper surfaces with Gloss White FS17875 undersurfaces, control surfaces, landing gear and wheel well interiors. Flat Black FS37038 radome and antiglare panel. Red, White and Blue wing, fin and stabilator tips. Modeller must paint stabilator tip Red, then trim with parts 51 & 52. Notice White rear edge to rudder. Fuselage/wing walk areas also painted Black. Note tail ECM fairing, antenna on inlet sides, and RIO's rear view mirror. Reference 2, page 7.



F-4J Phantom BuNo. 153809. Assigned to VF-31 *Tomicatters* aboard USS *Saratoga* (CV-60) during 1974. Painted Non-Specular Gull Gray FS36440 upper surfaces with Gloss White FS17875 undersurfaces; landing gear, and control surfaces with Flat Black FS37038 antiglare panel. Fuselage and wing walk areas Medium Gray. Note antennas, rear view mirror over rear canopy, tail ECM fairing. Reference 2, page 11.



F-4J Phantom BuNo. 155510. CAG bird flown by the *Diamondbacks* of VF-102 with Carrier Air Wing 17, USS *Independence* (CV-64) in 1976. Non-Specular Gull Gray FS36440 upper surfaces with Gloss White FS17875 undersurfaces, landing gear, and control surfaces. Fuselage/wing walk areas were outlined in Flat Black. Note ECM antenna fairings on tail and inlet trunks, RIO's rear view mirror. Reference 2, page 34.
