


LOCKHEED PV-1 VENTURA PATROL BOMBER



Distinctive with its greenhouse nose, the early versions of the Ventura were primarily deployed as maritime patrol bombers. Our kit of this famed plane represents a PV-1 of VB-136 squadron which was stationed in Adak, Alaska in 1943.

Developed from the Lockheed 18 Vega, the Ventura was originally designed for use by the RAF as a medium bomber. It was soon discovered that its best use was on maritime patrol where its range, speed and bomb load capacity made it the ideal weapons system. When the U.S. entered the war, the PV-1 Ventura was quickly put to use by the US Army Air Force in that same role.




ELEVATOR AND RUDDER ASSEMBLY






LANDING GEAR 9 SUB-ASSEMBLIES



WING SUB-ASSEMBLIES
















OPENING THE BOMB BAY (OPTIONAL)
