



The group experienced many technical difficulties with the landing gear and engines which reduced their effectiveness. After a move to Mabalacat air Base at Luzon, the Phillipines, the group was heavily engaged against superior American forces and was nearly wiped out by January 9th, 1945 when they flew their last mission.





from the most experienced personnel from several existing groups. Three Hikoti (squadrons) were formed; 301, 701, and 407.

The Shinsen-gumi (Elite Guard) 301 Hikotai was commanded by Lt. Naoshi Kanno, a veteran of the 341st Air Group in the Phillipines, where he was credited with 25 kills. The aircraft on this sheet is one of the first 200 production Shiden Kais distinguished by the larger vertical stabilizer. Lt. Kanno was lost in action on August 8, 1945 when one of his wing cannon exploded during an attack on a B-24 formation.
